

Marsh-Wentworth Case.

San Antonio, Texas. Nov. 21 .--In the case of Mary F. Ames, excutrix of John J. Marsh, against P. H. Wentworth, Jr., a priminent citizen of this city. Julge Maxey to-day made an order placing the Fort Terrett ranch, comprising 100,000 acres valued at abou \$300,000, in the hands of a receiver. This ranch is situated in Edwards, Kimball, Crockett and Sutton counties, Texas Mr. Marsh furnished the money and employd Mr. Wentworth to locate the land and purchase the live stock, agreeing that his compensation should be one-half of the net profis of the investment, after Mr. Marsh's funds invested had been repaid with interest. The ranch was established in 1881 with 42 sections of land already (whed by Mr. March as a nucleus, to which tie 100,000 arces was added by jurchase. The ranch was under the management of Mr. Wentwort un'il Mr. Marsh's death on May 17th, 1894 After Mr. Marsh's death 10,000 head of sheep on the ranch were se zed and sold by the Lockwood national bank. This. bill in equity was filed by Mrs. Ames as executr x of Mr. Marsh for the settlement of the business, alleging that not a dollar of Mr. Marsh's investment has ever been repaid by Mr. Wentworth, and also alleging that the latter is insolvent.
