

He was a UIL regional qualifier in accounting this past year; computer applications, was named Mad Scientist and on the A-B honor roll his junior year. Alfred held the offices of







The Board of Aldermen met in regular session May 6, reproduced elsewhere in the 1999 at 7 p.m. Present were Mayor

Galen Hromas, Aldermen Waters, Hughes, Stone, Wilkins, and Marshall. Guests were representatives from the Panhandle Regional Planning Commission and Duncan Disposal.

City Manager Contract Will Be Effective June The Bovina Board of

approved Aldermen Resolution 99-2 last week which is a contract with Panhandle Regional Planning Commission (PRPC) under the Interlocal Governmental Cooperation Act (IGCA) for contract City Manager

According to local sources the city has not had a city manager in almost ten years.

The IGCA provides for contractual agreements between local governmental entities to share resources. Under the agreement

with PRPC, the one-year contract provides for 104 days (832 hours) of service. The city manager, 25-year-old Ed Barrett, will work in Bovina two days per week.

However, when he begins on June 1, he plans to be in Bovina for 4-5 days to get acquainted with city personnel and learn his way

Barrett is a native of White Deer and has previous city manager experience. The total cost of the one-

year contract is \$34,018, which includes \$4,898 in travel expense. Barrett will

commute from Amarillo two days a week. Aldermen say that Barrett has access to. and knowledge of, various grants that could help the fire department and the city.

A provision in the contract allows either party to cancel the contract on 30-days written notice.







Too many Texans still die in drunk driving crashes. Sadly, in fact, Texas leads the nation in alcohol-related traffic fatalities. In 1997, the number of alcohol-related deaths on the roads in Texas alone accounted for more than 10 percent of the nation's total. But, it's time for a change and Texans are ready and waiting.

A recent statewide poll reported that the majority of Texans think current drunk driving laws are too lenient and that drivers who fail the sobriety test or refuses a police officer's request to take the test should have their driver's license suspended for longer periods than the current law allows. Overwhelmingly, 86 percent of Texans favor a one-year guaranteed license suspension period for repeat offenders.

Texas lawmakers have a chance to help turn the tide by adopting Senate Bill 1774, authored by state Senator Judith Zaffirini of Laredo. The bill lengthens the suspension period for second offenders and for those who refuse a sobriety test. The bill in its current form also allows officers to confiscate a driver's license upon arrest.

A wide cross section of organizations has thrown support behind the bill including Texas MADD; The Century Council, which is funded by America's leading distillers: the Texas District and County Attorneys Association; the Texas Medical Association; the Texas Academy of Family Physicians; USAA; the Texas Police Chief Association; AAA-Texas and other goups committed to reducing the number of alchohol-related fatalities in Texas.

Texans deserve, and opinion has swung firmly in favor of tougher laws to achieve them. Legislators have a great opportunity in SB 1774. The people of Texas deserve it.

S&WCD Receives Grant

The Texas Water Development Board today awarded eight matching grants (75% board-25% local district) from the Agricultural Conservation Grants to Districts Program.

This program allows local conservation districts to purchase equipment used in district programs to promote want, safer streets and public agricultural water conservation or water-quality

The eight grants totaled \$32,000. The Parmer County Soil & Water Conservation District (S&WCD) #140 in Friona received \$4,413 for flowmeter and equipment.

Other recipients of grant money were S&WCD Districts in Big Spring, Post, Dimmitt, Raymondville, Stanton, Hereford, and El Paso.
