A Valuable Truckload.

Perhaps as costly a commodity as any that is carried in considerable quantities in truckloads is Sumatra tobacco, such as is used for eigar wrap pers. Sumatra wrappers cost from \$1 to \$2 a pound, and the import duty on them is \$1.85 a pound. This tobaeco weighing 170 or 180 pounds each. Duty paid Sumatra would be worth about \$600 a bale, and there can be carried on a truck fifty bales or more; so that a 50 bale truckload of such tobacco would be worth about \$30,000.-New York Sun.






