YOU MAY NOT fully realize it, but the 1980s decade is just about a "goner." At the time you read this, only about two weeks remain in the year 1989, and in the 1980s

If you had hoped to accomplish something in this decade, then you'd better get a move on.

Earlier this month, we noticed a company advertising "The last really big sale of the 1980s," and for some reason, it was hard to believe that, like sands of an hour glass, the 1980s decade is slowly slipping away.

What will the 1980s be remembered for?

A lot of things have come to pass during the last ten years. We have had some good developments, but at the same time we have seen the emergence of the biggest health threat in decades, with the AIDS

It may turn out that events happening as the year 1989 winds down may be the most significant, at least from a political standpoint.

Events in Eastern Europe in the past few weeks and months are causing a new day to dawn in some of those countries. In recent weeks, with the fall of the Berlin Wall, we have been able to see history as it was being made.

Residents of such places as Eastern Germany, Poland and Czechoslovakia are demanding a change in their governments, to the point that Russian leaders are shaking in their boots.

The "Old Line" communism appears to be on the way out, and this will mark a historic change.

With the emergence of Mikhail Gorbachev, we have seen the leaders of the Soviet Union and the United States come together with a lot more hope, trust and xpectation.

This has raised more hopes for an end to the Cold War between the two super-powers, although some longtime political observers are warning us that we don't want to get too chummy with the Russian Bear.

But even though we have to keep our guard up, it gives you a lot to think about, and to hope for, especially at this time of the year, when Peace on Earth is spotlighted.

What a blessing it would be if, indeed, we could begin cutting back millions (or billions) of dollars which have been spent for defense each year, and use this money for more humanitarian

If, as the new 1990s decade dawns, we really could consider turning our swords into plowshares, what an improved world it could be, if mothers would not have to worry about their sons having to march off to war, as they have had to do in World Wars I and II, the Korean Conflict and in Vietnam during this century, just to name a few.

EVERY YEAR when you turn over the calendar year, you have to get used to writing the new year's number. Most years, you just have to remember to change one number (a five to a six, an eight to a nine, etc.)

This January 1, however, we'll have to remember to change two numbers, since '89 changes to '90.

And consider this: in ten more years, the 20th century will come to a close with the end of 1999, and like your old car's odometer passing a milestone, the year 2000 will dawn.

On that January 1, for the first time in 1,000 years, people will have to remember to change not one, not two or even three of the year's numerical features, but FOUR. As our friend Archie Echols would say, "That's exciting." It's ten years away, but it will be here before you know it. accomplish in the 1990s???

In the past, cash wages a farmer paid to his wife and children were exempt from FICA (Social Security) tax.

However, starting in 1989, cash wages paid to a spouse or child over 18 years of age are subject to FICA tax. Cash wages paid to family members under age 18 continue to be exempt from FICA liability, but the work and pay scale must be bona fide.

An alternative may be to pay a spouse, older child or regular employee in farm commodities.

Instead of paying cash wages, the farmer gives the employee a certain amount of his product such as corn, wheat, milk or livestock as wages. The worker then sells the commodities.

The commodity should actually be transferred to the employee, and the employee should sell it whenever he chooses. Keep records Dalton 4-4-12; Cindy Quintana 1of all paperwork involved to show that the employee handled the sale. Another helpful step would be to Martinez 3-0-6. segregate the farmer's and the employee's grain rather than comingling it if possible.
