## A TEXAS BOY IN $A^{2}$ ICA.

## Carlsbad Cumicni

The following letter to the S. Antonia Stan dard is from Jim Smith who rill be remember ed as having worked in the stic es hure in 1895

Bal to Creek,
East Africa, Porluges Territory Sune $13,1900$.
Dear Walter and Bunk: As romised, I will write. Guess you will be suiprised to hear from me. Well, I made the ti, fine; wasn't sick any more aîter the first eint days at sea; was so sick then, however, I fe off abont thir ty pounds and have never beet thble to regain it since I landed in Beira, E. st Africa, one month ago with $\$ 60$. She lastec me four days when it was all gone. Every i me you turn a corner it costs you \$5. But the ct is plenty of work here. A man with a fair e facation cau do well here, or a good tradesman, and they pay you not less than $\$ 125$. a month; but every time that you go and get a meal she costs you 75 cents and isn't as good as army grab and you know how we used to kick in army; and When you take a drink she cost. you 25 cents.
I landed 1,700 miles south of ere, at Cape Town, and came up the country towards the Transvaal and went broke and had to go to work, and you all know that nearly broke my heare bnt I got a good job as a fireman on the
 a month, but she costs me $\$ 75$. for board and $\$ 25$. for whiskey, so I have a pretty good sala ry left.

This is a worse place than Fort St. Philip Louisiana; they can't hardly get men to work here in the summer, it is winter here now. Ev ery man that works for the railroad company is furnished from one to three negroes to help him. I have got two, one to shovel coal and another to do my washing: they work fors2.50 a month and their board and clothes; they don't eat any thing but rice and don't hardly wear any clothes; but they are kept in their place better here than the negroes are in the states.
They are not allowed to walk on the sidewalks; they run in the streets like dogs.
I am going to stay here until the war is over and then I am going into the Transvaal.
I am in the Portugese territory and can't get out, for the line is guarded and no one but soldiers can cross it until the war is over, unless you get a pass from the portugese war office at Mozambique and at the war office in London. Any one who goes across without a pass will be given four years in prison, so you see I am tied up, but I dont care much so long as I hold my job.
I have not seen Gearge Bent? I heard that he was in Cape Town.
Jack Miles and Dock Moss are making $\$ 140$. a month and their board; they both have their saddles with them and they are a great sight to the people here. Jack loaded a fellow up that he could rope a zabra on a horse and si he has not seen a zebra since he has been hert
Jack and Dock are both lying around doing nothing; every day is just like Sunday them-having a good time.
But there are a great many wild animals here. You can see the lions out on the rail-

Irood track and hear rhem howl at night aad Jou can bet that I dont get off the engine after dark. The funniest thing that I have ever seen was a drove of about 100 monkeys emi grating; they were all playing along, having a good time.
Well Bunk, you and Thomp give all the boys my best regards and if you don't answer this and tell me all the news you had better.

## ［H，J．R．No．35．］

JOINT RESOLUTION，amending Article 8，of the Constitution of the state of Texas，by adding thereto Section 20，providing for the organization of irriga－ tion districts，and for the levying aud collection of a tax for the construction of reservoirs，dams and canals
Be it resolved by the Lagislature of the State of Texas：
That Article 8．of the Constitution of the State of Texas，be amended by adding thereto Section 20 ，as fol－
Section 20．In addition to the powers of taxation granted in the foregoing sections，it shall be lawful for the Legislature of Texas to authorize the Jand owners Knox to organize irrigation districts in said counties withost regard to county line
In making provisious for th
rrigation works within said texas－of construction of to levy tases aud create an indebreaness to rest as a charge on and be secured by a lien ou the irrigable land for the use and benefit of which said irrigation worka have been or may be conatructed．The Legislature may authorize such taxes and indebledness as may be neces－ sary to construct irrigation works witbin said territory， but no taxes shall be levied nor indebtedness created in any district until authorized ky a twa－thirds vote of the esident land owners there wasceptible The Governor heblired to
