## County Commissioners Grant Dr. Gayao Another Five Years

Monday, June 30th, all of the county commissioners, with the exception of one, gained their quorum to make the final decision on the two proposals submitted to them for the five-year lease of the Callahan General Hospital. Two proposals were submitted to the commissioners on June 20th, one by Dr. Gayao, who has held the lease on the hospital for the past five years, and the other by the United Hospital Corporation out of Memphis, Tenn. Judge Mac Kniffen began the meeting by accepting the motion that Dr. Gayao be allowed to re-lease the hospital

for the upcoming five years. The motion was carried and the vote was unanimous in Dr. Gauao's favor.

There was a suggestion made by Judge Mac Kniffen that a hospital committee be provided complying of five commissioners, four of those to be voted into the committee by the other commissioners. Each of the four commissioners would have a representative from his area and this county to enable the citizens to have a more active part in hospital business. The finalization of this suggestion may be discussed at a further date.

## Law Enforcement Officers Confirm Identification Of Body

Since May 13th, the Callahan Sheriff's Dept. has been trying to identify the body of a young man found in a shallow grave near a dirt road about a mile off state Hwy. 36. Friday, June 27th, the body was identified to be that of Johnny Raymond Sanchez of Abilene. Sanchez was last seen March 12th, one day before his 28th birthday.

Law enforcement officers were upheld in confirming Sanchez's identification when they were unsuccessful in obtaining his military records, which were presumably destroyed. Sheriff Bill Skinner said the murder may have stemmed from Sanchez's involvement in drugs.

Sanchez had a record of two marijuana arrests and a 1977 conviction for posses-

sion of two pounds of marijuana. Sanchez was in a probation violation trial in July of 1978, and was facing misdemeanor marijuana possession charges following an arrest at West Texas University. He was then committed to Rusk State Hospital for the criminally insane. He was later released and placed back on probation. He had last reported to his probation officer on March 7th.

It was through court ordered dental records from Rusk State Hospital and x-rays revealing a compounded fracture which Sanchez acquired in 1969 and through the identification of Sanchez's clothing by family members that the law enforcement agency was able to confirm the identification of Sanchez.

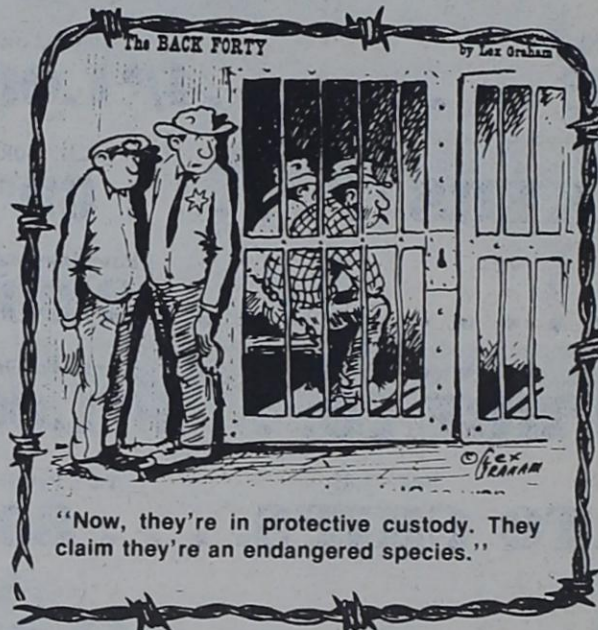

## Weaver Promoted to Private

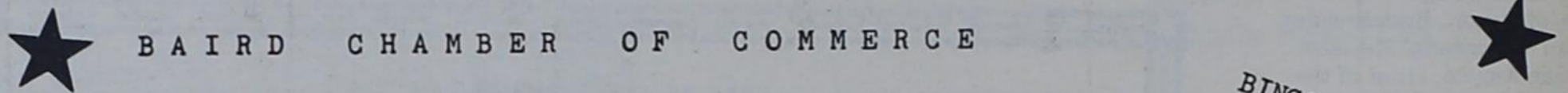

The promotion was based upon these qualities and the demonstrated potential for increased responsibilities.

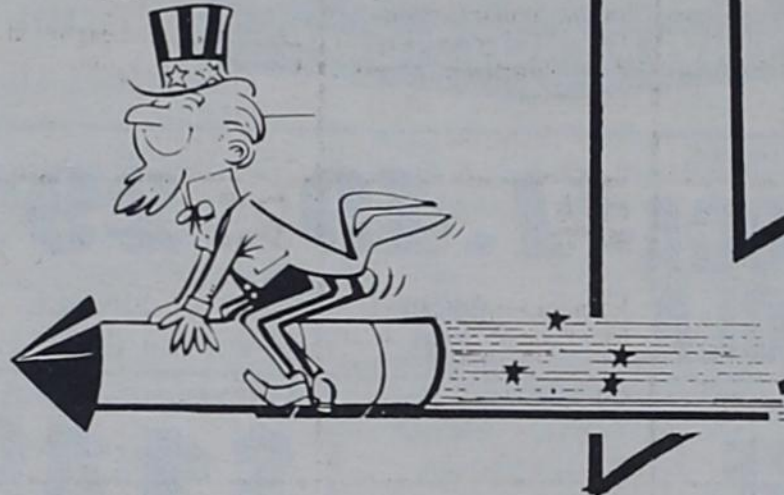

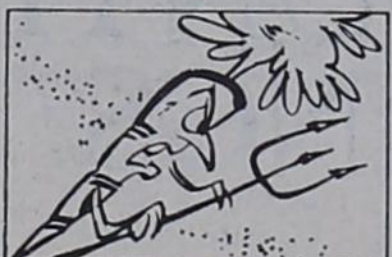

Mrs. Brady, of Merkel and Mrs. Blackburn of Hawley will entertain and all area musicians are invited to attend for some good gospel singing.

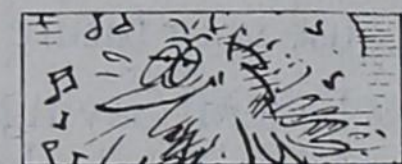
## City Council Holds Special Meeting July 7th
