the Legislature was not the same as the statute signed by the Governor. In a decision issued Sept. 11, Judge
McCown ruled that the "enrolled bill
rule" applied to HB 2566 and that he was prevented from looking past the bill as signed by the Governor, Lt Governor and the Speaker of the

"making exceptions to the rule o makishing the rule should be done by the court of appeals or the (Texas

Shape into a loaf and place in a shallow baking pan, bake about an hour in 350 degree oven. <br> Here's a neat idea--shape the meat (usually $1 / 2 \mathrm{lb}$. per person serving) mixture into individual servings and place them side by side in a loaf pan. Here are the additions, or variation you can add or change.
