brought in two 21 -foot radar-equipp-
ed boats, in addition to the radar patrol boat already assigned to the
lake," Caude said. "We.re using. hese three boats for night patrols."
Caudle said that by Feb. 16, game Caudle said that by Feb. 16, game
wardens had confiscated 32,600 feet of gill netting, 1,200 feet of trotlines
and 12 hoop nets. He said the fishermen usually come from across
the lake in Mexican waters, where
netting is legal and set their nets in netting is legal, and set their nets in
Texas waters at night. on white bass, which are just now beginning their spawning run up the
Rio Grande from the main lake. Hoop nets, which also are illegal in
Texas waters, take mostly catfish. Caudle said that on a recent surveillance flight over the lake he
counted 70 Mexican commercial fishing boats and reports indicate as many as 200 boats may be fishing the

GARDENING TIME!! Vegetable gardeners planning on producing a bumper crop should begin their spring preparations by
instituting a soil insect control instituting a soil insect control
program. There are many factors that we as
gardeners simply have no control such as fainfall or lack, humidity,
and other environmental factors. But and other environmental factors. But
there are a number of things the ore gardener can do to help insure Site selection is important but so is an insect control program. The initial step to defeating soil

step, soil insects can reduce vegetable quality and yields.
Destructive sol insects include
wireworms, white grubs, seed corn maggots, cabbage maggots, mole
crickets, sowbugs, slugs, snails, and rickets, sow ns, Some destroy plant seeds,
cutworms. roots, tubers, and underground ste parts while others cut off young
plants at or near the soil surface.
