Cotton Loves
Hot Days

| UVALDE, Texas-Cotton is thriving in the sizzling heat that has inundated the Winter Garden the last several weeks. It's beginning to bloom and crop, said Dr. J.W. Stewart, entomologist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. <br> The unseasonably hot weather, accompanied by high wind, is causing desiccation of the soil surface and increasing water requirements, Stewart said. <br> "With a completely dry soil profile at the beginning of the year, excellent spring rains have been depleted. More rain is needed right now to maintain growing momentum," he said. <br> Several cotton pests are making a nuisance of themselves in the Winter Garden. If growers need to control the cotton bollworm and boll weevil, pyrethroids should be used. Growers are encouraged not to use synthetic pyrethroids for the next couple of weeks, he said. |
