# PUBLIC NOTICE <br> BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENT CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 6, 1990 

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE bALLOT Senate Joint Resolution 2, Sixth Called Session, 71 st Legislature,
proposes a constitutional amendment to provide that if the Senate at proposes a constitutional amendment to provide that if the Senate, at
any special session, does not take final action to confirm or reject any special session, does nor take inal action to confirm or reject
an appointee of the Governor made during a recess of the Senate, the appointee is entitled to continue in office until the Senate rejects the appointee at a subsequent session or until the Governor appoints another person to fill the vacancy, but such a nominee whom the
Senate does not act to confirm or reject at a subsequent regular ession is considered to be rejected when the session ends.

| SAN ANTONIO, IX--A common question voiced at the Medicine Wheel by non-Native American Christians is, "Where does Jesus Christ fit in to all of this?", or some form thereof. As a Christian pastor in attendance of the Medicine Wheel for several years, I am in hope that I may address this question from a pastoral perspective and perhaps bring some clarity to this issue. <br> The thoughts expressed by the Native American religious leaders at the with the Gospel message of Jesus Christ. Rather they are some times either parallel, expansions, or direct repetition of the Gospel message. If one were to lay out in writing the Wheel with Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, (Matthew 5-7) for example, the reader would find not just similarities but exact parallels and restatements of the propositions of Christ in this central document of the the parallels of the Letter of James, the Letters of Peter, several of Paul's Epistles, and, of course, the Revelation of John. ## Operation Game Thief

| Game Thief nine months ago has evolved into more than $\$ 80,000$ in fines for anglers and business owners in four Texas counties, according to Texas Parks and Wildlife Dep <br> Law enforcement officials began serving warrants to 34 people on Sept. 6 after a nine-month investigation at Lake Texoma and waters below the dam. Warrants were issued for illegally buying and selling game fish, which included striped bass, hybrid stripers, sand bass and paddlefish, and endangered species in Texas. Many of the fish were sold to certain restaurants and fish markets in Dallas. <br> Capt. Bill Daniel, law enforcement regional director from Mount PleasGrayson County, 103 in Dallas County, 71 in Collin County and 30 in Rockwall County. More than 1,000 fish were involved in operation, however, only 346 were used in the prosecution. <br> Through Sept. 12, \$80,218 in fines had been assessed, not including civil Sixteen people were arrested in Grayson, 36 cases were pleaded In guilty while 175 guilty pleas were entered for a total of $\$ 59,587$ in fines. All 70 cases in Collin County were guilty pleas and $\$ 16,275$ in fines were handed down. Two people in Rockwall County pleaded guilty to 22 cases and were fined $\$ 4,356$. Game wardens filed 11 cases on four restaurants and two market operators in Dallas County. | added later, Daniel said. <br> Capt. Carlos Vaca, who adminisTPWD, said restitution charges vary according to size. Striped bass and hybrid stripers range from $\$ 2.26$ to $\$ 116$ and white bass range from $\$ 1.55$ to $\$ 26.14$. Restitution charge for at this time. <br> Daniel said more than 80 other cases are under investigation and charges will be filed later. <br> This is the third covert operation in East Texas in recent months resulting from an Operation Game Thief call. This operation was the second largest redfish investigation in 1988 that resulted in arrests of fishermen and restaurant owners from the Gulf Coast to Dallas. <br> 'This has been a nine month operation and there is no telling how long this illegal activity has been going on," said Chester Burdett, TPWD law enforcement division director. "We are going to continue our surveilance to protect the resources. <br> 'The Operation Game Thief program gets information that would not otherwise be available," Burdett said. "This is a big operation that may have gone on a lot longer, and more of the resource may have been hurt. <br> To report game law violations call Operation Game Thief at 1-800-792GAME. Callers may remain anonymous and may be eligible for a reward. |

| As we continue to receive rain in most areas of Kinney County, I hea reports of a variety of problems ranches. These problems seem to be at a peak when we have a wet year following a drought period. <br> Pneumonia in calves can be greatly accelerated during the fall season, particularly with viruses, bacteria and other germs present. <br> Stress factors contributing to pneumonia include weaning, hunger, thirst, castration, dehorning, adverse weather, abusive handing, shipping, fatigue and mixing with other cattle. Viruses involved are IBR, PI3, BVD, reoviruses, rhinoviruses, adenoviruses, herpes viruses and syncytial viruses. Bacteria types include pastviruses.
