

## Cart Path Completed

| The herculean task was completed by a volunteer work crew of an average of 20 men per day in 10.5 working days. A total of 1260 manhours were volunteered at a calculated value of $\$ 10,080.00$. This figure does not include an estimated savings of $32 \%$ for workmen's compensation and insurance. Crushed limestone in the amount of 1300 tons was hauled, dumped, shoveled spread, watered down and rolled by over 65 years. Most important of all, the job was completed using several pieces of heavy equipment without a serious injury to anyone. <br> The old saying "Behind every successful man there is a woman," was evident in this project as delicious lunches were provided every full workday by 15 volunteer ladies to satisfy the hearty appetites of the workers. <br> The light contrasting color of the cart path surface adds to the appearance of the golf course. The paths are raised an average of two inches to provide golfers an oppor- tunity to avoid mud holes and dust bowls. Use of the new paths will allow grass to grow in several of the places which are bare because of "follow the leader" type traffic <br> We can all show our appreciation and take pride in our golf course by helping preserve the playing surface and encouraging others to do the same. <br> A beautification committee was formed to continue work on the |

the early stages of pregnancy Hay selection is critical to maximum nutrient supply per dollars spent. Careful selection will allow the horseowner to avoid pur
chasing inferior quality hay that could potentially contribute to digestive disorders such as colic Horse owners who intend to pur-
chase large amounts of hay chase large amounts of hay at a time
will benefit from retrieving a core wample of hay that can be analyzed for nutrient content. Hay should always be selected on
important visual criteria Charac mportant visual criteria. Charac-
teristics of good quality may include (1) a high leaf to stem ratio, (2) a fresh smell and appearance, (3) cleanliness (free of weeds, trash,
dirt) and (4) to some extent the color of they hay. Hay that is stemy has been cut at a more mature stage of growth and will be significantly
lower in nutrient supply and lower in nutrient supply and
digestibility. The presence of weeds in the hay affects total quality and some weeds may be highly toxic to
horses. Hay that smells the least bit
musty or moldy should be avoided.
