Fall gardening at hand: Although
it's the middle of summer, it's time to start getting things in shape for a
fall vegetale garden. Many home
gardeners have enjoyed a relatively high level of success this spring
primarily due to better-than-average
growing conditions and relatively mild insect problems.
In this area of Texas, gardening can continue almost year round. The
months of July, August and Sep-
tember are times to plant many popular vegetable crops such as
tomatoes, peppers, eggplant, beans, potatoes, okra and squash.
Cold hardy vegetables such as
broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, greens, parsley and carrots can be
planted at this time for early harvest. Later plantings of theses cold
hardy crops should supply fresh
verete vegetables well into winter in most
areas of Texas. should consider several factors prior
to establishing a fall garden. If the fall garden follows a spring garden
where good fertilization practices
have been used, usually little if any have been used, usually little if any
additional fertilizer should be ap-
plied prior to planting. If the fall plied prior to planting. If the fall
garden is a new garden or in a new
area then pounds of complete fertilizer per 100
square feet worked well into the soil prior to planting should be adequate.
Later on, if plant growth seems slow fertilizer watered in between the
rows is highly advisabie. A very important consideration
for successful fall gardening is an
adequate supply of water. Since
most fall gardens are planted during most fall gardens are planted during
the heat of late August and Septem-
ber. sufficient water during ger-
mination and early growth is vitally
important A important. Avoid letting the soil dry
out and crust, even if this means a
light application of water several with a yard sprinkler until the seeds
have sprouted, emerged and are
making adequate growth. After the making adequate growth. After the
plants have had a chance eto establish
a strong root system, the gardener
should consider switchin or furrow method of applying water.
Avoid any type flood as this seriously affects later yields.
As with spring gardening, the best practice is to transplant most
vegetable crops in the garden. It's a good idea to protect transplants
from excessive heat and wind when
they are first put out in the garden. And also with any Texas garden, fall
gardens are subject to many of the
same problems you might experience as with spring lambs. namely
weeds. diseases and insects. many vegetable crops grown in fall
