NEW I-9 FORM AFFECTS HIRING PRACTICES OF ALIL EMPLOYIRERS:

Whether hiring one person or
1,000 all employers will be affected by changes in the new I-9 form released recently by the U.S. Im-
migration and Naturalization migration and Naturalization Ser-
vice.
The previous I- 9 form, a part of the Immigration Reform and Con-
trol Act (IRCA) of 1986 trol Act (IRCA) of 1986, mandated legal right to work in this country. The most pertinent change in the
revised form is the increst revised form is the increased emphasis on informing employers
about the anti-discrimination provision of the law. The new document carries this antidiscrimination notice: "It is illegal to
discriminate against work eligite discriminate against work eligible
individuals. Employers CANNOT specify which documents they will accept from an employee. The
refusal to hire an individual beca of a future expiration date may also constitute illegal discrimination." When the law was being debated in 1986, many in Congress expressed great concerns that the
citizenship requirements would discriminate against Hispanics and others. Unfortunately, these fears turned out to be well-founded.
A survey showed that indeed 18 percent of the employers who being discrimi hiring practices were percentage was 28 percext -. the highest of any state surveyed under this particular law. However,
changes in the new form should help prevent discriminatory practices,
which were found to be mostly uninwhich were found to be mostly unin
tentional. The form also was revised to clear up any question as to which documents would satisfy the identity and authorization requirements.
What many employers would do is ask to see one of the several documents listed on the old form as being acceptable. If an applicant did
not have it, the employer would not have it, the employer would not
hire the person, when in fact there were many other acceptable documents not listed. The new form does not give a specific list, but a
separate, expanded list that employers can use to match up the
plicants.
Another change on the $1-9$ is the addition of a third section, which
deals with reverification of temrequested an expiration date, but

years. Some established taxidermists have reported a $100 \%$ in-
crease in TROPHY whitetail brought in to be mounted over the
last few years. Quail numbers were up over past years and turkey
populations have been on the populations have been on the in
crease. Texas Trophy Hunters, owner
Jerry Johnson, based out of San An tonio, Texas, has published some outstanding trophies in their journal
taken in the ' $90-91$ ' season. What is the reason for this sudden hunters' bonanza of TROPHY deer? Could it be hunters have suddenly out-foxed find him to be an easy challenge? don't think so. It has been said over the generations a true TROPHY whitetail is one of the hardest game
species in the world to harvest. So what's really going on?

experience positive results within three years if a proper game management program is utilized.
I've personally seen ranches subIve personally seen ranches sub-
stantially improve their buck deer in stantialy improve their buck deer in
body weight, antler size and
TROPHY INDEX in a few short TROPHY INEXX in a few short
years. Some ranches and sportsmen years. Some ranches and sportsmen
supplement their management supplement their management
program with special high mineral-
protein nutrient feeding programs that also contribute to ho
development and healthier deer. It is extremely important that yo regulate the buck harvest with a
minimum antler size. Some ranches
use 8 -points minimum, 16 -inch
spread: others use 10 -points use 8 -points minimum, 16 -inch
spread others use 10 -points
minimum. This minimum point
restriction allows the buck to restriction allows the bucks to att
an age of $31 / 2$ years or older. De generally do not reach their prime
until they are $5^{1 / 2}$ to $7^{1 / 2}$ years old until they are $5^{1 / 2}$ to $71 / 2$ years old.
This is when they sport TROPHY antlers.
Meat hunters can also help the herd by selectively harvesting does which will in turn keep a proper
