The cause of migraine headaches remains unclear, but it is felt that there is a dys
function of the control of the
muscular walls of the small arterial blood vessels in the brain and around the scalp. contract or dilate excessively producing the throbbing
headache of a migraine. headache of a migraine
Although not curable. Although not curab medications that can or control migraine symptoms. Some medications such as beta blockers or calcium blockers, if taken on a daily basis, may effective ly prevent migraine attacks
Other medications which help prevent the dilation of help prevent the dilation
arterial blood vessels may prevent a severe attack once the headache begins. Pain medications may be useful for some patients, but usually these headaches are so severe that they are not well controlled with over-thecounter pain medications
such as aspirin or acsuch as aspirin
taminophen.
If one suffers from severe episodic headaches, they may well have a form of migraine It is recommended that they see their primary care physician. He may suggest consultation with a
neurologist to assist w neurologist to assist wi headaches.
