## New Ambulance Ready For Service <br> suraged us to look into obtaining

Medical Service (E.M.S.) is a county administered department located in ${ }^{\text {Brackettville, }}$ Kinney County, Texas, 120 miles west of San An-
tonio on Highway 90 . It is surrounded by 4 other rural counties, Edwards to the north, Uvalde to the east, Maverick to the south, and Val Verde to the west.
A salaried Diirector/Coordinator service. In addition six Texas cer-
tified attendats tified attendants receive monetary
incentives of $\$ 100.00$ monthly, a supplement of $\$ 20.00$ per tran sport. Depending on the work force available and the needs of the service, these paid technicians are ex-
pected to accept calls approximately pected to accept calls approximately
$30+$ hours a week in addition to their regular job and family obligations. In addition, four volun-
teer technicians and five volut teer technicians and five voluntee
drivers remain available to plement the regular staff. Acting a first responders, covering staffing shortages and multi-casualty in
cidents, the volunters continuall support the County Emergency support the
All continuing education courses, drills and seminars are attended by
volunteers and paid personnel volunteers and paid personnel on
personal time. This often requires using annual leave from their regular employment.
The E.M.S. res The E.M.S. responds to all
emergency calls in Kinney County presently operating two Basic Life Support ambulances, answering an
average of $15-20$ calls average of $15-20$ calls per month.
Calls range from Multi-
Casuatsy Multi-Casualty/Aulti-Trauma Motor
Vhaicle Accidents, General Trauma, Vehicle Accidents, General Trauma,
Cardiac and Diabetic emergencies to Cardiac and Diabetic emergencies
interdepartmental standby for the interdepartmental stander
Volunteer Fire Department, Police,
Sherift Sheriff, and U. S. Border Patrol
agencies. On a voluntary basis agencies. On a voluntary basis
technicians provide coverage for all technicians provide coverage for all
local events such as home football games, rodeos, fairs, etc., at no cost to the various organizations served. United Medical Center, a small Family Practice Clinic located in
Brackettvile serves all of Kinney Brackettvile serves all of Kinney
County. The clinic has a minor emergency treatment room. As a doctor and medical personnel are
not available on a 24 hour, 7 day a week basis, the clinic cannot be considered for receiving all emergency patients requiring skilled care.
The nearest hospitals are locat 35 miles west in Del Rio, 45 miles east in Uvalde, and 45 miles south in Eagle Pass. Laughlin A.F.B.
Hospital, 25 miles west receive only military personnel and dependents. The closest major Trauma Center is 120 miles east in San Antonio.
In mid 1991, we began to realize
there was a definite need to there was a definite need to consider the purchase of a new ambulance.
Our secondary ambulance (donated to our service by Nat Mendolshon
the original developer of Fort Clark Springs Association) is a 1976 Type II, (High Top Van). The comhad become obsolete, difficult and had become obsolete, difficult and
expensive to maintain. The vehicle
and it's equipment had proven to be and it's equipment had proven to be
unreliable, often breaking down while transporting patients to the
hospital.
When this vehicle was urged into When this vehicle was urged into
service, technicians not only faced the prospect of critical life
threatening emergencies, but had to threatening emergencies, but had to
cope with the likelihood of vehicle breakdowns while anticipating
essential equipment failures. Adessential equipment failures. Additionally, they had to contend with outated communication equip-
ment, requiring the technician to interrupt patient care to communicate
with dispatchers, law enforcement, support personnel and hospital
medical direction. Diminished tran-
smission distance and com-
munication channels being used to munication channels being used the
capacity was another burden on the
technicians. technicians.
Owing to the many problems en-
countered by using the countered by using the secondary ambulance, the primary ambulance, specialty van (commonly called a required to support the greatest part of the emergency load. Consequently it exhibits signs of age and rapid
deterioration. Therefore problems faced in using the same dary ambulance could soon be expected with the primary ambulance if a remedy was not initiated in the
near future. near future.
Kinney County is a rural to
wilderness area covering widerness area covering 1,391
square miles having a total population of 3,119 . The county is comprised of the towns of Bracket-
tville (population of 1,740 ), Spofford (population 68), and the private resort community of Fort Clark Springs (estimated population 780 ).
The remoteness of the area inThe remoteness of the area in-
creases response time combining to form major factors in patient morbidity. At best, quick response to
emergency calls is difficult and emergency calls is difficult and
taxes the resources of our emergen-
With taxes the resources of our emergen-
cy medical system. With
cinadequate, unreliable, and outdated inadequate, unreliable, and outdated
equipment, the task of responding to equipment, the task of responding to
and safely transporting our citizens and safely transporting our citizen
and the countless visitors to our area
could become nearly impossible could become nearly impossible.
To improve vehicle reliability, we hoped to retire the 1975 Chevrolet
Type II ambulance by August of 1992 placing it into service as a much needed Rescue Vehicle for the Brackettville Volunteer Fire Depar-
tment. A new Type I truck would be purchased and assigned as the primary ambulance, with reassignment of the Type III modular am-
bulance currently in use as our bulance currently in use as our
primary unit to a secondary vehicle This would improce response and
transport reliability and minimize transport reliability and minimiz
much of the expense of repairs. much of the expense of repairs.
Secondly, installation of Secondly, installation of new
mobile multi-channel radio equipment on each ambulance would give
technicians access to all technicians access to all medical
facilities, law enforcement and sup faciilities, law enforcement and sup
port personnel. The addition of hand
held hert personnel. The addition of hand
technicians in indios would allow technicians in the field to com-
municate critical information municate critical information to
support personnel, without interrup ting patient care.
The installation of mobile telephone equipment in each am- am-
bulance would allow technicians to communicate dillow technicians to
directly physicians and nurses. Transmitting and receiving vital information critical to care, while maintaining
complete patient privacy. This also would permit technicians to receive would permit technicians to receive
lifesavin directions from the
receiving hospital, while eliminating receiving hospital, while eliminating
many problems encountered by many problems encountered by
using multi-user radio channels.
Last, replacing outdated medical Last, replacing outdated medical
equipment and adding specialized equipment and adding specialized
patient monitoring equipment would patient monitoring equipment woul
enable the technicians to improve
the quality of care, enhance patient the quality of care, enhance patient
comfort and confidence, and reduce comfort and confidence, and reduce
morbidity.
The E.M.S. Department had bee The E.M.S. Department had been
spared cuts in 1991-1992, retaining spared cuts in $1991-1992$, retaining
its operating budget of $\$ \$ 7,000$
which includes salaries and estimated revenues generated of
$\$ 5,000$. Since no provisions had been made in past budgets for
capital replacement capital replacement, no plan could
be made in the 1991-1992 budget for be made in the 1991-1992 budget for
immediate purchase of a new ammmediate purchase of a new am
bulance. The 1991-1992 budget did provide a designated fund allowing
for replacement and for replacen The possibility of achieving our
goals was discouraging, until we contacted several ambulance sales
representatives in regards to the representatives in regards to the

The The ad advertised a grant writing Historical being held by The Texas Street Project. E.M.S. Direc tor/Coordinator Kay Smith was sent to the workshop by the county in the process and fome insility of into the process and feasibility of ob-
taining a grant for a new ambulance Kay came home with an arm load of information and a basic plan of ac tion. With the commitment of mat-
ching funds obtained by the county ching funds obtained by the county
through certificates of obligation, as well as letters of support from the County Commissioners Court and
the City of Brackettville the project hegan. The project involved the
development of a needs analysis, basic proposal, bid specifications and cost anayssis for the ambulance
and equipment. With all this completed, research was begun to ascertain which foundations would be most likely to respond favorably to ur proposal. Finally three foon-
dations were chosen. The Meadows Foundation located in Dallas was the first choice. The proposal was made.
We had been told numerous times We had been told numerous times
the probability of receiving a grant the probabiilty of receiving a grant
from the first foundation we applied to was unlikely. We were prepared to receive a rejection. To our mazement we received a positive
response. On January 10, 1992, we received word our proposal was being considered and would go to he foundation's Grant Review
Committee for final decision. We committee for final decision. We
began to pray. On February 24, 1992, it happened. our grant proposal was approved. On April 10,
1992, a check in the amount of $\$ 39,625.00$ was received by County
Judge Tim Ward. Our prayers were Judge Tim
answered. On June 26, 1992, Crew Chief
Steve Safford and EMT End and Technical Systems Advisor Chet Puda flew to Orlando, Florida, to take possession of our new am-
bulance. They, with the new ambulance. They, with the new am-
bulance, arrived in Brackettville on Monday, June 29, 1992.
The ambulance is now undergoing preparations for the Texas
Department of Public Health Inspection for certification. We expect to begin using it by Monday, July
13. The E.M.S. would like to take his opportunity to give a very heart-
