coughing, chest pain, shortness of breath, fever, night, sweats, poor
appetite, weight loss, and coughing appetite, weight loss, and coughing
up blood. Although tuberculosis is a potentially fatal disease, six months of treatment with tuberculosis drugs is relatively inexpensive and almost always cures the patient. The
leading cause of failure to cure is incomplete treatment. Because sympoms generally disappear early, many patients stop taking
medication before six months and develop resistance to the medications. These drug resistant
strains are more strains are more dangerous and cease the risk of fatality
Infected persons who have not yet
developed tuberculosis can benefit from therapy also. Their therapy generally does not require as many
drugs, but still require 6 to
the. The Texas Department of Health has $\$ 9.4$ million in state funds and
$\$ 900,000$ in federal fund to fight tuberculosis. By targeting high risk groups such as those with HIV, the elderly, prison inmates, drug users and minorities, TDH
