propose that a trade be made, the propose that a trade be made, the
City's Filippone Building for the County's swimming pool. The City's
priority is a meeting hall priority is a meeting hall.
Negotiations continue. Hopefully compatible solution will result
benefiting all parties. Nothing is
finalized. A financial dilemma presents itself to all concerned entities. The City cannot afford to build or buy another meeting room facility and keep the Filippone Building. It must
be one or the other, not both. The City definitely prefers that the building become a museum. The Disability Laws demand a first floor
meeting room, of which the City meeting room, of which rene
cannot afford to continue renting in definitely.
A final solution must come to pass. This issue should not be
allowed to continue for allowed to continue for another 8

Unfortunately, if no positive action is taken to procure the building for the Historical Commission, the City has no choice but to take possession so

and burial ther than dishonorable are eligible for a government-provided headstone requirement because of active duty during periods such as the Persian Gulf War. Before enactment of the new law, reservists who had served on active duty for training were not eligible for these benefits. The law now makes eligible all who have completed at least 20 years of qualifying
reserve duty.
In Fiscal year 1992, VA provided 302,975 headstones and markers for
veterans.
VA always provides for the cost of transporting the headstone or pay for the cost of placing the reavemarker.

tolerable is actually a death sentenThe dietary requirements of most domestic pets. An improper diet can result in serious nutritional deficiencies such as rickets and other crip
pling conditions. Most wild animals are normally
most active at night. This perfectly most active at night. This perfectly
normal behavior can be very disrup-
tive to persons trying to tive to persons trying to sleep and
attempts to change it may be very frtustrating to the animal itself. Many diseases which affect
people can be carried even by people can be carried even by
healthy-looking wild animals. Rabies is one such disease an
others include leptospirosis, tularemia and plague. Preventive
vaccines against vaccines against these diseases ar
not approved for use in wildlife. Most wild animals are protecte by various federal and state laws and permission from the proper authorities must be obtained befor keeping a wild animal.
When you are tempted to tak home a wild animal for a pet, ask yourself these questiong: 1. Is what I Im doing legal? and possibly the life, of myself an my family?
3. Am I willing to risk destroying the animal?
4. Am I willing to change my
lifestyle to conform to the animal lifestyle to conform to the anima'
natural and unaterable behavior? If you cannot truthfully answe
"yes" to each question, do not a "yes" to each question, do not a
tempt to keep a wild animal as a pet.
