Despite weekly export sales, as re ported by USDA, that exceeded indus try estimates, cotton futures on the New York Cotton Exchange closed New York Cotton Exchange closed lower for the third consecutive day on Thursday and at

market observers expected a good week market observers expected a good week
of solid export shipments in light of the of solid export shipments in light of the
recent high Step 2 payment, but thought recent high Step 2 payment, but thought sales might be slim. Part of their reasoning was the transition between the old and new crop year and a lack of demand on the cash marke

## The week's export sales were consid-

erably higher than the previous week, but shipments decreased. However, the current marketing year will draw to a close at the end of July, and the latest export figures have traders saying USDA's 11.5 million bale exporttarget for the year will be met.
For the week ended July 10, USDA reported net upland exports reached 230,000 bales. The figure was 7 percent below the previous week and four percent lower than the four-week average. Net upland sales of 116,300 bales were 64 percent higher than the previous week and an 80 percent increase from the four-week average. Meanwhile net sales of 11,300 bales were made for
delivery in the 2003-04 marketing year In other news, market observers ke n eye on Hurricane Claudette which made landfall along the Texas coast on Tuesday. With Texas, the top-produc ing cotton state, having been battered by be $w$ eatheraleady this year, traders by bad weather already thisyear, traders expressed some concern about cotton crop.
Market anxieties were alleviated when it appeared the storm would miss the bulk of the Texas cotton crop. Claudette struck the Texas Upper Coastal Bend and moved inland north of Corpus Christi. Gusty winds and heavy rains of as much as three inches per hour were reported in some areas and caused flash flooding. However, most of the Coastal Bend remained dry, and some rainfall would have been welcomed to help boost crop development. Elsewhere in the state, hot and dry weather prevailed on the High and Rolling Plains with above-average temperatures recorded. Hence, cumulative heat units are rising and boosting plant growth.
Meanwhile, seasonable conditions prevailed in the Far West; however, Califormia's San Joaquin Valley cotton crop is in various stages of growth making water and pest management diffithe Memphis Territory this week in-
creasing water demand. In fact, many farmers have begun irrigating to ease heat stress and to reduce boll shed Some non-irrigated stands already have blooms at the top due to shallow root systems, and light boll shed has been reported. Therefore, a general rain is needed soon to prevent premature "cutout" and excessive shedding.
Overall, U.S. cotton crop conditions mproved as of July 13 , according to USDA. The department's data showed 53 percent of the U.S. crop was in good excellent condition while 16 percent rop was in poor to very poor schedule with squaring progress at only 71 percent compared to 84 percent one year ago and the five-year verage of 84 percent. Additionally, boll setting was at 28 percent compared with 38 percent the previous year and the five-year average of 39 percent.
On the spot cotton scene, online sales by Texas, Oklahoma and Kansas producers decreased in the five trading days ending July 17 as 5,069 bales were sold compared to the previous week when 9,641 bales changed hands. Prices received by producers selling their cotton online ranged from 49.78 to 51.65 cents per pound versus the previous week's 50.21 to 51.75 cents per pound range.
