lawsuit scheduled for hearing Oc-
tober 4. The thrust is to force
"uxitale provision" for public
school funding as provided in the
Texas Constitution.
Board President Bader, who also
serves on the TASB board, em-
phasized that TASB had not taken
sides in any law suits to this point
but had represented all school
districts, but is now seeking united
support of all districts in a suit to
guarantee adequate funding from
the state and reduce the burden on
the local school districts. (Superin-
tendent Mills has wwitten an ex-
cellent article and it follows this
report. Elsewhere in this issue is a
roster of law makers. with ad-
dersses/phone numbers).

plosive to simulate bombs) followed by an interdiction attack by a B-52 or B-1.

as Indians, slaves, and the U.S. Army including the Federal Gov
nment. Their friendship carried over into the Confederacy. John R.
Baylor evidently moved to Weather-
ford to be with his family perhaps to be more available to the
newspaper the two partners were
publishing in Weatherford publishing in Weatherford. John, George Baylor, and Hamner were
among the first in Parker County to
become advocates of become advocates of Secession of
Texas and that seems to come about
from or received it's their Indian hating.

slowly. Infected trees will have gum slowly. Infected trees will have gum
or wax forming on the main trunk and main limbs.
Fall spray in South Texas is mos often applied from November 15 to
December 15. Application time will December 15. Application time will
vary with the season, so check your fruit trees closely.
Fall spraying is important to the health and production of fruit trees,
because there's no other time when because there's no other time when
