Trappers are reminded that the
fur-bearing animal season is December 1 through January 31 ,
except for muskrat and nutria. Muskrat season is November 15
through March 15 while nutria may be taken year round.

Wildlife Department game warden
in Austin said fur-bearing animals in Austin, said fur-bearing animals
may be taken for the purpose of sale may be taken for the purpose of sale
only during these seasons. Texas
statutes define fur-bearing animals as badgers, beavers, foxines, minkss,

and civet cats. A $\$ 5$ trapper's fee ( $\$ 250$ for
nonresidents) is required to take furnonresidents) is required to take fur-

How Not To Overeat During The Holidays

A: The holidays are times for family gatherings,
Christmas shopping, parties - and eating - enough to and eating - enough to
5 to 7 pounds heavier come the first of the year.
Five to 7 pounds is the average a mount that peopl gain during the holiday season and is actually very
easy to gain. If you take in easy to gain. If you take in
an extra 500 calories a day, just in little extra treats, you'll gain about a pound a week and that's not hard to do with all the cookies and
sweets around work. Many sweets around work. Many people get into trouble by
letting the holidays linger letting the holidays linger
on for several months, start ing with Halloween and continuing through the Super Bowl. Even though
it's normal for people to it's normal for people to overeat this time of year, it's
better if you can limit it to a better if you can limit it to a
few days instead of two months.

However, when you plan
overeating the most imon overeating the most imget additional exercise. To so calories extra 17,500 or so calories consumed over
the holidays, you will have to walk 175 miles. Burning 100 calories per mile, it will take you over 58 days of walking 3 miles per day to shed the extra pounds. While maintaining your
weight over the holidays caight over the holidays can be difficult, it isn't im-
possible. There are several things you can do to survive the holidays at your present weight:

- Having a positive attitude is very important. If you you won't gain weigh Don't approach holida meals after fasting all day from gorging when you ar rive at a party
Never stand at a buffet o hors d'oeuvres table; take
one or two items and move across the room and talk with someone. - Keep in mind that alcohol does have calories. If egg
nog is served, limit your-

self to one punch cup which has 335 calories. If you want to try everything at the buffet, take a fourth or a third of the average serving size. seconds to please an insis tent hostess. - Don't use holidays and vacations as an e
gaining weight. Don't neglect exercise or physical activity. Eat desert two hours after the main meal. This will snack usually eaten later. Concentrate on socializ-
ing and being with people. Don't make food the Just say "no thanks", easier than you think Watch out for salty foods
they will trigger your appetite for more. Also, salty
dishes tend to make you more thirsty. Chew gum while prepar ing and cleaning up the tempted to snack. Remember to eat slowly and savor every mouthful; you will be satisfied with
