only 2,705 voters. Lubbock County, only 2,705 voters. Lubbock County,
by comparison had 23,929 voters in the senate race.
Lubbock County likewise did not have any heated local runoffs on the ballot--just a local candidate If Potter County could have mustered ten or 15 per cen tor heir the difference in the election.
A longtime county political observer told us Monday "Our area just blew it. They had the opportunity
to get their man' into the senate, and to get 'their man' into the senate,
they just didn't come out to vote." Saturday's sace reminded ye editor of another race about a decade ago, when the state's voters were casting ballots on the prospects of adopting a water plan which would have
provided for importation of water for this area.
That vote was turned down, and we recall that in that one, if the voters of this area, which had the most to gain, had turned out with a little more
fervor the issue would have passed. Its failure was a hard blow to the West Texas area.
The failure of conservative-minded people to bother to go to the polls last Saturday may also prove costly, if the
liberal Lloyd Doggett wins the election in the fall.
