A little later in the spring, the Mockingbirds should be back. We've had a pair of Mockers who raised their babies in the Mulberry tree the past few summers. It's a treat to watch these pretty birds, who also like to scold your dogs and cats for being out in the yard.

Earlier-on, we had a number of Flickers, which are a red-headed bird in the woodpecker family. According to our bird books, the Flicker is the only woodpecker that feeds on the ground rather than in trees. You can see this fellow feeding along the highway medians at times, with his distinct black crest on his chest. He's a goodsized bird, larger than a pigeon.

Longtime residents, and even newcomers may think that this area hosts precious few varieties of birds, but upon closer inspection, one will find out that this isn't exactly true.

One of the cutest and most unusual birds we've watched in our backyard feeding area this winter were the Cedar Waxwings.

They are just larger than a sparrow, with a tuft on their heads like the jays. These birds have little black masks, and look like a flock edge of the water-bowl. And they almost always travel in large groups. There have been 10 to 15 of the attractive little birds that visited our place during the past month.

The Waxwings won't eat your birdseed, but prefer berries or fruit. We're probably just as lucky that they go back north for the summertime, because the bird book says it isn't unusual to see several of them in a berry tree. The unusual thing about the Waxwings is that the bird at the top will pick a berry and the group will pass it along the limb, one to another. Don't know if the top bird ever gets to eat or not.

Arguelles, 53, has been charged with possession of narcotics with intent to distribute after law of bandits when they sit around the enforcement agencies raided a ranch and uncovered 535 pounds of pure cocaine, with a street value of \$90 million, according to Hobbs, New Mexico Police Chief Steve Lasater.

Lasater said two boats, one houseboat, three vehicles, and four hand guns and the ranch were seized.

Lasater thanked the Parmer County Sheriff's Office for its cooperation in the three month investigation.

Parmer County Sheriff Bill Morgan said police began checking on Arguelles in 1984. He had moved to a site just east of Farwell in 1982.

The checks intensified within the past 18 months. "People think you're not doing anything, but trying to get the big law enforcement people involved--who have the facilities--takes time," said Morgan. "We don't have the money to fly around and check on all things."

Morgan said he didn't believe major drug trafficking was taking place here. "They were staying clear of here," he said.

Morgan said the other law enforcement agencies would call. his office and say, "We need this....' and we would try to comply. All the agencies worked together.





Population should be maintained at a fairly high level. It makes sense to grow this yellow even if you don't have a contract for sale. Good quality grain is always in demand.




