Texans should no longer tolerate state prison policies that contribute dened criminals freed on "good dime, criminals freed on "good
timed serving only a fraction of their actual sentences behind bars.
It is time to reform the so-called
good time credit system which was good in the past to help reduce prison overcrowding. By this fall our prison expansion program will have
added more than 100,000 prison beds during the past five years and that will provide efficient capacity to
keep violent and repeat offenders keep violent and
incarcerated.
incarcerated.
Reforming
Reforming the policy is the
responsibility of the Texas Board of Criminal Justice and both Governor George W. Bush and I are encouraging the Board to act swiftly
and decisively on several badly needed reforms.
The basic concept of good time credit, properly used, is a valid tool in prison management to encourage
better inmate behavior. But because of prison overcrowding in the past,

## Tax Deferral Available For Elderly Homeowners

Texans aged 65 or older may postpone paying delinquent and current property taxes on their homes. They may take advantage of a tax option Appraisal District office. This special form of tax relief also halts a lawsuit filed to collect delinquent taxes on an older Texan's home, according to Marcus Tidwell, chief appraiser of the Kinney County Appraisal District. "To stop a deferral affidavit with the court in which the suit is pending.'
"If the affidavit is on file, an older homeowner cannot lose a homestead because of delinquent taxes," Tidwell said. Once a homeowner files an over-65 tax deferral affidavit with the appraisal district, no taxing unit
can start or continue a lawsuit for delinquent taxes as long as that person owns and lives in that home.
Tidwellstressed that tax deferral for the elderly only postpones paying delinquent taxes on the home; it does not cancel them. During the deferral time, taxes and interest of $8 \%$ per year continue to add up he
said. "When the elderly taxpayer no longer owns and lives in the the taxes become due. If the taxes are not paid, taxing units can then sue to collect all the deferred taxes and interest.
There is no penalty on the delinquent taxes during the deferral time.
However, filing the deferral affidavit will not forgive penalties that were already due. Also, if the taxes remain delinquent more than 90 days after the deferral ends, a taxing unit may charge an added penalty if the account goes to a delinquent tax attorney.

homeowner should fill out the form and have the signature witnessed notary public," Tidwell said. For more information, taxpayers may con-

## Addicts Need Treatment, Not an Allowance

Dent to feed thatconolics don't need an allowance fro the gover ent that is what the Suptions. They need treatment. the Social Security Administration, currently does: It guarantees substance abusers an entitlement based upon their addiction. As strange as it sounds, the government now classifies substance abuse
as a disability. This means addicts and alcoholics qualify for SSI payments as a disability. This means addicts and alcoholics qualify for SSI payments which they can - and do - use to supply their addictions, rather than to sense. SSI payments made under these circumstances provide a pervers incentive to beneficiaries: We pay them to stay on drugs, we pay them not to The drug addicts and acohery

The drug addicts and alcoholics program within SSI was intended to support these individuals while they were under treatment. But that's not how
things worked out. The program is easy to qualify for, but difficult to monitor Rehabilitation is actually discouraged, because rehabilitation results in beneficiaries being dropped from the program.

In the words of one doctor who has spent her professional career dealing with the problems of addiction, SSI payments "...Undermine the very thing

tion." In 1994, 101,000 drug addicts and alcoholics were on the SSI rolls and
received an estimated $\$ 382$ millin in fers received an estimated $\$ 382$ million in federal benefits - benefits that came out of the pockets of responsible, taxpaying Americans. The SSI caseload of drug addicts and alcoholics has expanded 700 per
cent since 1988 , when there were only 13,000 such individual cent since 1988 , when there were only 13,000 such individuals in the
program. At the current rate of increase, their numbers are expected to rise to program. At the current rate
200,000 within five years.
Sadly, only 10 percent ever recover and drop off the SSI rolls. Taken as
an indicator of the efficacy of this program such recorery rote an indicator of the efficacy of this program, such a recovery rate is devastat-

providing these individuals the means to continue their freefall into addiction. There is something fundamentally wrong with a government program which pays drug addicts to remain addicted and pays alcoholics to co
drinking. Congress cannot in good conscience continue this policy. So this week I introduced a bill to stop payments to individual addicts, and instead re-dedicate those resources to addiction research and treatmen
programs. Public funds will be put to more constructive alternative uses, and progrety as a whole will benefit because treatment programs reduce crimina Substance abuse is taking a horrible toll on our s

available at your local appraisal district office... or you may draft a similar form.

## Who must file a rendition?

You must file a rendition if you own tangible persona property that is used to produce income-such as

 The advantrages of filing a rendition aseYou give your opinion of your property's value. If the appraisal district believes the value is higher, it must notify you in writing of the higher value
and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.

- You record your correct mailing address so your tax bills will go to the right address. If your bill is you responsible for paying your taxes on time or
paying extra charges for late payments.
- You can also file a "report of decreased value" to notify the appraisal district of significant depre ciation of the value of your property in 1994. The ing a value in 1995.

What's the deadline?
The last day for filing or postmarking 1995 rendition is Friday, April 14 . You can get an extra 15 days
if you ask for it in writing by the April 14 deadline.
