Due to the financial crisis the County Commissioners, County Judge, and the various department heads have been meeting in Special
Meetings in an attempt to address the serious issue and come up with deas to help get us through this dark time. The Commissioners Court has asked the various deparcuts in existing departmental budget balances to help cut expenses and his has been done. This is, of coure, only a temporary "band-aid" and
does not address the overall problem. Une Tommy Seargeant County Judge Tommy Seargeant
has been working closely with this writer in attempts to obtain comitments from the U.S. Bureau of
risons and the U.S. Marshal's Service to enhance the federal prisoner numbers at the county jail. They have promised to try and do all they
can to increase our federal prisoner numbers. The problem is that BOP must fill up their own prison facilities first before they are acilities for large numbers of ederal prisoners. Many other counties throughout Texas that have come to depend too much on federal are experiencing the same financial runches.

classroom of children in a mat ter of days, making its way home to infect entire households. The symptoms of this dis-
ease are fairly easy to detect.The whites of the eyes become pin or red, and the eye feels gritty when blinked. The eye also proforms a crust during the night This sticky crust can seal the eye shut and you may have to pry the crusts in the morning. There also can be blurred vision and a sen itivity to light.
The irritati armless condition results from an inflammation of the transpar ent membrane that lines the eye
lids and a portion of the eyeball. It is caused by a viral or bacterial infection, or by an allergic reac-
tion.

Home Rule School Districts A Bad Idea By RICHARD KOURI, President Texas State Teachers Association
The concept of home rule school districts is one of the most dangerous ideas to be introduced in${ }^{\text {to }}$ this legislative session. Masquerading as local control, it is
in fact a dirty little plot to rob children of educational opportunities and to punish Texas teachers. Home rule advocates advance the
peculiar idea that schools will peculiar idea that schools will be
somehow better if their boards are free of all state standards. Never mind that the standards that are in place have been respon-
sible for demonstrable improvemen sible for demonstrable improvement several years.
Home rule
Home rule advocates want local
school boards to be free to school boards to be free to increase
class size in elementary grades, to class size in elementary grades, to
hire uncertified teachers, to ignore the state required curriculum, to eject children from school and to fire teachers without cause, to do

past several years. It's little wonder that this untested idea has not been seriously proposed, much less adopted, in any other state
