Answer: Thousands of accidental poisonings occureach year, so it's
wise to be prepared in case one happens in your home. If you suspect someone has
been poisoned, contact the Poison Control Center. The specialtrainced to deal with such emergencies. The Poison Control Cen-
ter number should be listed onthe inside cover of the yellowor white pages or your telephone book. For exposures to the skin or
eyes, it is okay to flood them with eyes, it is okay to flood them with
plain tap water and to remove clothing that is contaminated. For all poisonings that are swallowed,
do not give anything by mouth or cause vomiting unless advised to do so by the poison information experts. If recommended, syrup
of ipecac may be used to induce vomiting.
When you call the Poison Control Center, it is ismoitant that
you have the following informayou have the following informa-
tion available:


The victim's age and weight,
and the time of the poisoning and the time of the poisoning.
How much poison the victim - was exposed to. found on the label, or the appear-

occur, the Poison Center will try to help you manage the problem at
home or direct you to the home or direct you to the closest
treatment facility, and will continue to assist in the management of the poisoning, if necessary.

Individuals, schools, churches, civic organizations churches, and
municipalities were meeting the municipalities were meeting the
challenge of collecting paper, cans, bottles, etc., without giving much thought to the next step in making the economics of recycling work -
buying products made of recycled buying products made of recycled
materials. People simply had not materials. People simply had not
been adequately educated on the been adequately educated on the
need to "close the loop" on
recycling.
Well, things have changed. A
growing world economy and a growing world economy and a
demand for recycled products not
known since World War II have known since World War II have
emptied the warehouses and swept emptied the war
the docks clean.
Part of the demand is from
foreign entrepreneurs who have foreign entrepreneurs who have
learned they can make various ex earned hey can make various ex-
port items cheaper from what we used to call "trash" than they could
with virgin materials. Part of it stems from governmental action
such as we have here in Texas such as we have here in Texas
where state agencies are required to where state agencies are required to
spend a portion of their procurement
budgets on spend a portion of their procuremacts,
budgets on recycled product
giving prefererice to those that cost giving preference
no more than other products. Much of it comers from successful
educational efforts including the educational efforts including the
General Land Office's program to General Land Office's program to
encourage businesses not only to encourage basiesseser for recycling,
save their wastep
but -- importantly - to purchase but - importantly - to purchase
products made of reccycled material. There are many recycling success stories in Texas that have created
new jobs and reduced the waster new jobs and reduced the waster
stream. Garry Mauro, Comstream. Garry Mauro, Com-
missioner, Texas General Land Of-
fice, cites two fice, cites two. Champion International, in 1993 ,
opened a \(\$ 100\) million state-of-theart de-inking plant near Houston to
turn old newspapers and magazines turn old newspapers and magazines
into reusable newsprint. It has a deal
with the City with the City of Houston to supply
most of its paper needs through most of its paper needs through a
curbside pickup program. While this curbside pickup program. While this
has resulted in a flow of thousands of tons of newspapers and and
magazines to the plant for magazines to the plant for recycling,
the supply, from about 100,000 of the supply, from about 100,000 of
Houston's 350,000 homes, fell far short of what the plant could ac-
commodate.
Houston was wary of the cost of
expanding the pickup program so
Champion se expanding the pickup program so
Champion set up its own collection program, including placement of
1,200 collection bins in Houston and 1,200 collection bins in Houston and
1,000 in Dallas, many of them at 1,000 in Dallas, many of them at
schools that also serva nearby schools that also serva nearby
neighborhoods. The schools make
money --Champion pays them for money - Champion pays them for
what they collect. And the plant is now running at near capacity,
recycling 200,000 tons of paper anrecycling 200,000 tons of paper an
nually, the equivalent of saving 600,000 cubic yards of landfill
space. Champion spokesman Seth Kur-
sman says his company is extending sman says his company is extending
its collection program to other cities.
