

THE so-called teacher competency test, or "Basic Skills Test," which is one of the mandates of House Bill 72, is perhaps one of the worst aspects of HB 72, which has caused practically a complete rearrangement of our educational system.

In the first place, how can a test determine how well an individual can teach?

The test is basically a reading determine if teachers are competent at formal writing, and how well they can teach.

An incompetent teacher who is a December 23, 1923. good writer could easily pass the test, and be labeled as "qualified," while a longtime, successful teacher, who does not do well at writing, could possibly fail the test.

The proof as to how well a teacher does is in his or her day-today performance in the classroom, and how well they relate to the how well, or even how badly, a

teacher does in the classroom.
