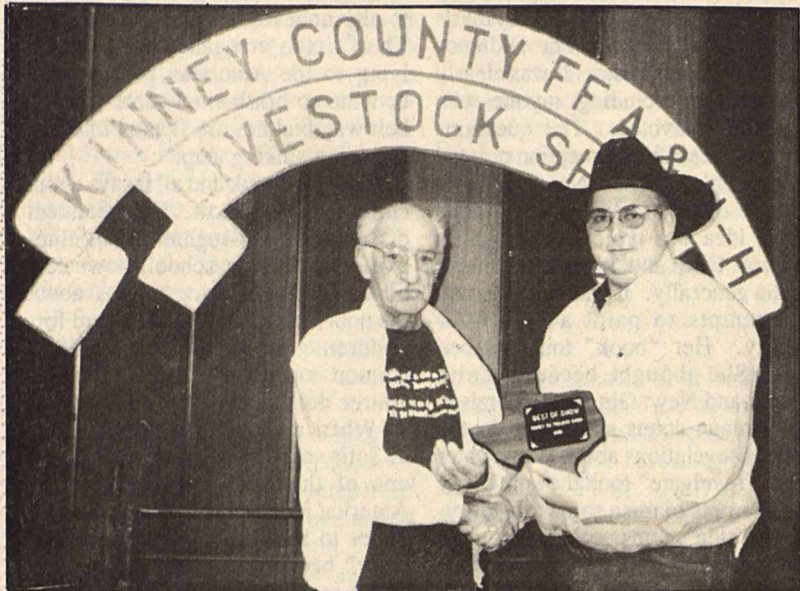

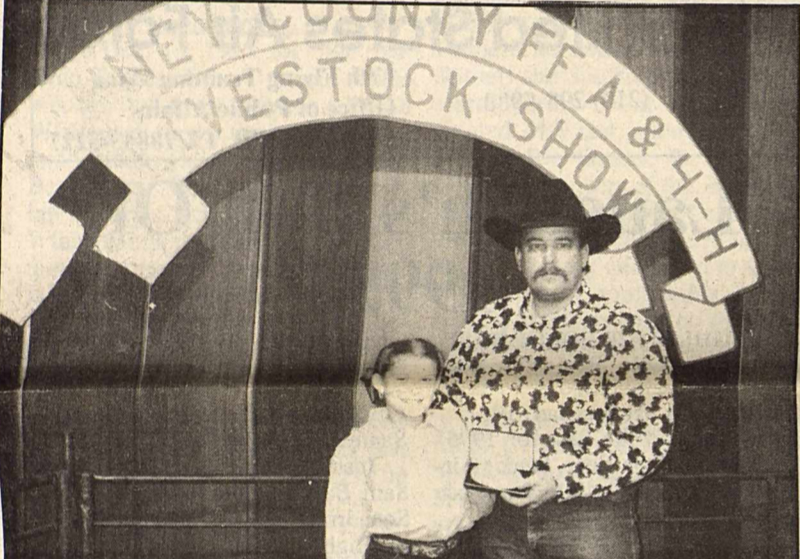

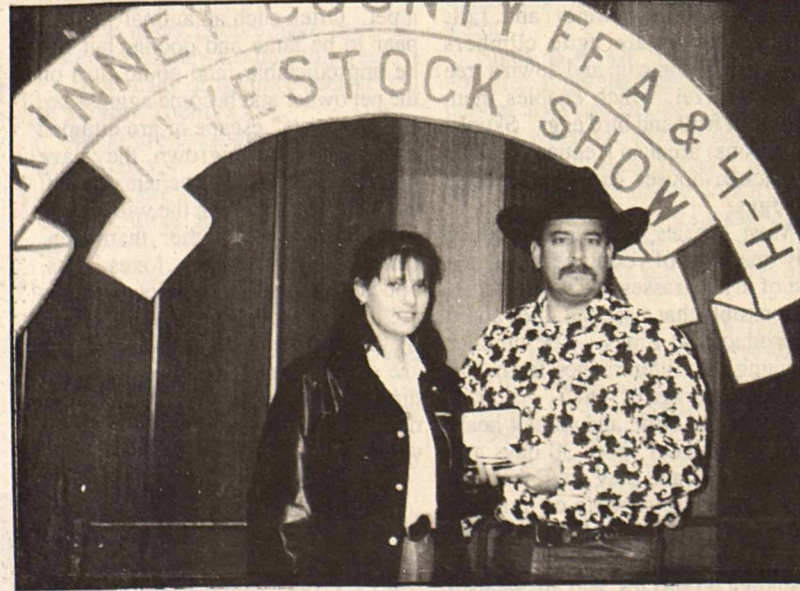

Brackett Landmark Goes Up In Flames

Fire alarms sounded shortly after 9 AM, Wednesday January 24. The old Gateway Hotel building was on fire! Fire department personnel dropped what they were doing and raced from all directions to the location. Personnel did everything possible with the equipment they have, but the old building was going fast.

It was a spectacular yet very disheartening sight. Flames leaping high into the sky and out the doors and windows. Highway patrol, Sheriff Department and Game Warden officers closed US 90 to traffic for 3 city blocks, and closed Ann Street for 1 block. All traffic was routed away from the smoke and flames. The front gate to Fort Clark was closed and the back gate on SH 131 had to be opened for an entrance. Gas service was turned off for a 3 block area by quick acting City crews. The Del Rio Fire department responded with 3 trucks, arriving around 10:30 AM.

By 1 PM the fire had been reduced to an ember and everyone was taking a well earned break. At 3 PM fire alarms again sounded, the old building was not yet willing to give up.

The old Gateway, as it is now called, was built in the mid 1930's by Alex Schubach. Alex called it the Home Oil Service Station. There was a car dealer in the back of the building and a package store at the side. Bill Riley said he remembers making the trip to San Antonio with Mr. Schubach to buy gas. "That old muffler on his truck was just shooting out flames and making an awful racket all the way".

Thru the years the building has housed several businesses: a fancy hotel, apartments, Tom Roselle's law office, liquor store, bar, several restaurants, washateria, beauty shops, gift shop, insurance office and many more we are not aware of at this time.

The present owner of the building is Mike Roselle, son of Evelyn Roselle, grandson of Alex Schubach. The Community Council Office was located in the office at the back of the building. Beverly Wright, Community Council director, was in San Antonio at the time of the fire. Beverly said that was 10 years of work and many personal items gone.

The Community Council will be located at the Head Start building temporarily, phone number 563-2407.



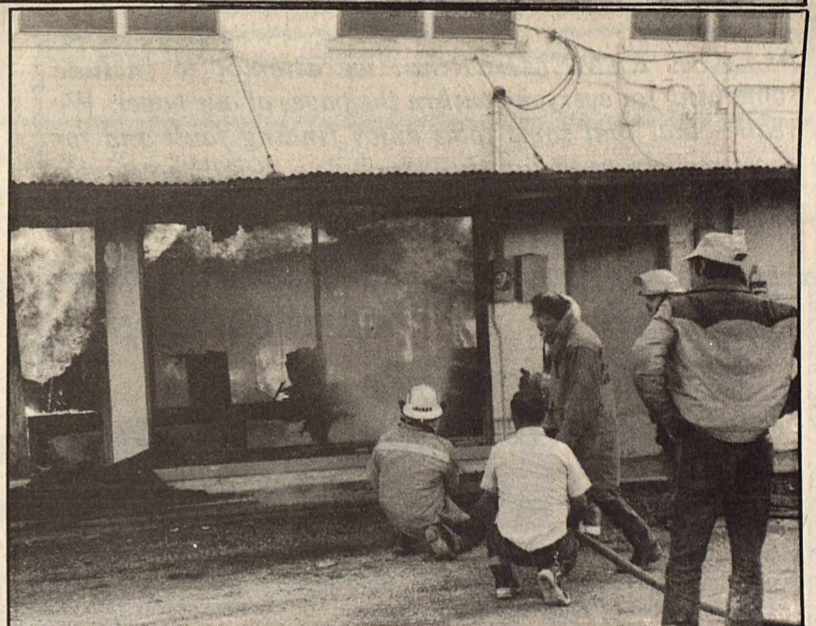
Our Observation:

A Growing Concern

There is opposition growing to the application of Adobe Eco-Systems, Inc. for a state permit to dump 830 tons per day of solid municipal and three classes of industrial wastes on a 1400 acre landfill site immediately adjacent to Spofford and within about 9 miles of Ft. Clark Springs and Brackettville, Texas. The dump site will be accessed by railroad cars shipping from far and wide and by trucks along Hwy. 131 (between Brackettville and Eagle Pass).

Adobe, the unexperienced operator of the landfill from Fredericksburg, will develop the landfill site under the name "Rio Grande Regional Municipal Solid Waste Landfill Facility" in the same location previously sought by Texcor, if granted a permit. Texcor was denied a permit, by the Texas Natural Resources Conservation Commission (TNRCC), in their bid to dump radioactive waste at the site in the fall of 1994.

Last fall, in an interview with the "Express News", Jim Stephens, President of Adobe, said that no waste will be shipped from Mexico. However, in Adobe's prospectus they state:

"Adobe Eco-Systems, Inc. is developing a Landfill near Spofford, Texas...that systematically addresses the concerns of the Host community

and its customers across America. The Greater Rio Grande Regional Waste Management Facility is being designed...to offer competitive prices nationwide....Adobe Eco-Systems, Inc. has also negotiated to purchase an additional 7200 acres immediately adjacent to the site....A national railway line is located east of the property and is an integral part of Adobe Eco-Systems, Inc.'s business plan for the facility....This excellent rail access and handling allows the Rio Grande facility to completely serve virtually all major metropolitan areas in the United States....Adobe Eco-Systems, Inc. has been contacted by Maquiladora companies along the Texas/Mexico Border. There is currently a need for a safe and efficient way to dispose of the thousands of tons of waste generated by these companies daily. Government officials have contracted us about solving these problems on a long term bases (sic). Union Pacific has expressed an interest in Joint Venturing collection facilities in South and Central Texas. We have also discussed Joint Venturing a barge off loading facility in Corpus Christi, Texas...."

In Adobe's case, the word "landfill" is just a fancy name, or euphuism, for "toxic garbage pit". The three types of industrial wastes Adobe proposes to dump with their permit are: Class I: toxic, corrosive, flammable and dangerous to human health. Class III: building materials, construction debris and in-

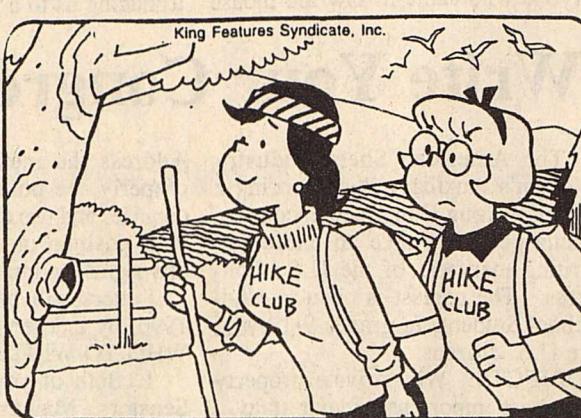

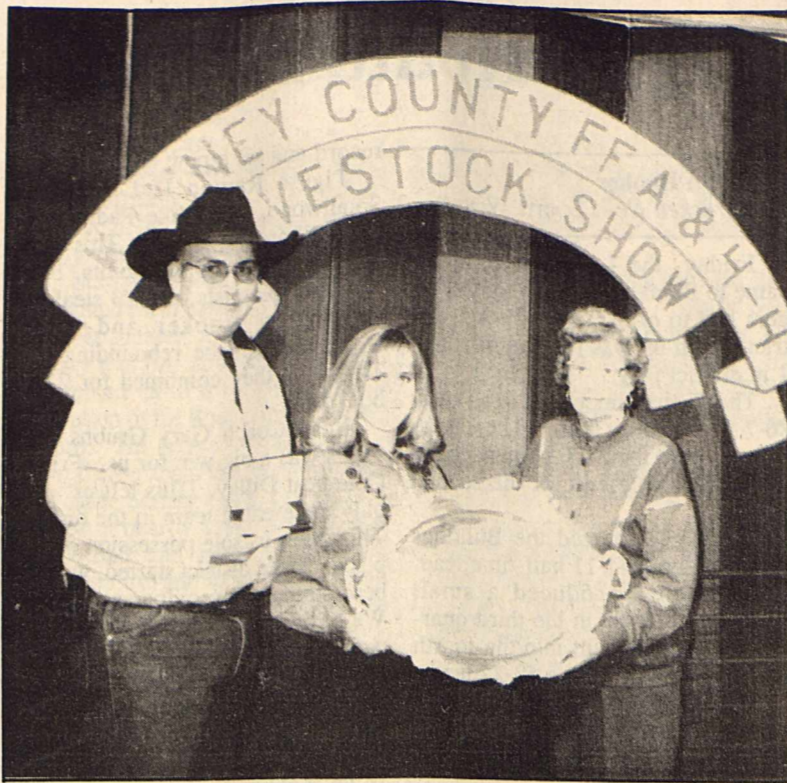
