Stan Conoly, local rancher, presented a program on the sheep Rotary Club on April the 3rd Dr Charles Schmidt, April program chairman, introduced him. Conoly began a brief back ground on the industry by asking if Rotary members realized that Columbus was basically a rancher. Conoly is well known for his dry wit and his disbelieving audience laughed, but he justified his statement by saying that after lumbus had brought thirty head of sheep to this country. These were small animals, but acclimatized to this area very well, surviving the eat and rocky soil.

## Knee Arthroscopy: "Tiny" Surgery, big results

Pioneered by orthopaedic surgeons with an interest in sports medicine, arthroscopy of the knee
was among the first of the truly was among the first of the truly
revolutionary developments in modern surgery. Literally, hundreds of surgical procedures that used to require a large open incision can now be performed using far less invasive methods. Arthroscopic surgeries allow the surgeon to look inside the body with special instruments that per-
mit the surgeon to remove dammit the surgeon to ren with much aged tissues and bone with much
less risk of infection than with open surgery
Arthroscopy can be used for the treatment of injuries to the menisci (rubbery shock absorbers of the knee) or cruciate ligaments (crisscrossed stabilizers of the
knee) and has even been used sucknee) and has even been used suc-
cessfully in the treatment of the early stages of osteoarthritis of the early
knee.
Prior to the introduction of Prior to the introduction of lage injuries that would not heal on their own could only be treated using open surgery. This required a long recovery period and an extended hospital stay. Before arthroscopic surgery, any signifi-
cant cartilage tear was usually cant cartilage tear was usually
treated with complete or nearly
complete removal of the menis-
cus. However, when the menisci cus. However, when the menisci
are removed, the knee loses its are removed, the knee loses its
normal lubricating and shock-absorbing mechanism which can lead to an arthritic reaction in the area of cartilage removal. The initial breakthrough of arthroscopic surgery, and its continuing refinement, has made it possible to remove only the areas
of cartilage that have been torn of cartilage that have been torn, In some instances, it is now posIn some instances, it is now pos-
sible to repair a fresh tear using arthroscopic techniques with out having to remove any of the torn cartilage. This means that hundreds of thousands of high-school, college, and adult athletes are now able to lead active lives following
arthroscopy, without the rapid arthroscopy, without the rapid
deterioration of bone in the joint that often followed complete removal of the meniscus. However,
even for those adults with arthritic even for those adults with arthritic knees (who may or may not have had a meniscus removed in a prior surgery) arthroscopic surgery can
