Local school officials will meet with representa Local school officials will meet with representato protest being assigned the use of state value on appraised land in Kinney County
"Once a year, the state tax division does a sampling of local appraisal district ratios," Bracket Superintendent Taylor Stephenson said.
"What they do is compare local values to state values. In some cases, it's comparing the appraisal within five percent.
"If we exceed five percent variation from local to what they think the value is, they assign a state value," he added.

## Hummingbirds are migrating throughout Texas

AUSTIN- The spring migraTexas has begun and the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department is seeking the help of the
birdwatching public in the agency's ongoing survey that is in its fourth year. So far, the Texas Hummingbird Roundup has resulted in the compilation of one
of the largest databases yard hummingbird observations in the nation and has generated some surprising observations about the tiny iridescent creatures.
Since the Roundup's inception, thousands of backyard birders have sent in their findings regarding hummers.
