Local Lions host 12th annual Health Fair The way I see it!

The local Lions Club hosted its 12th annual Health Fair last Thursday.

With over 380 people signed in, the event was well attended. Eye exams, hearing test, blood pressure and blood sugar tests were free of charge. Flu and pneumonia shot were also available for a nominal fee.

Members of the Texas Department of Health were on hand to administer the Flu and pneumonia shots.

The Lions Sight Research Foundation had their Mobile Eye Screening Unit (MESU) giving visual acuity and inter ocular eye pressure (Glaucoma) test.

The research foundation was formed in 1982 by the Lions Club of Texas District 2-A2. Fund raising for the MESU began in 1995. Through the help of the Lions of the District 2-A2, H.E.B., state funding, numerous private and University benefactors the MESU became a reality in the spring of 1996.

The Ankle Brachial Index test screens for peripheral arterial disease in the lower extremities. Studies suggest an abnormal ABI may indicate peripheral arterial disease as well as a high risk of coronary artery disease. The procedure consists of placing a blood pressure cuff and



Bonilla's District **Stays Intact**

Washington D.C. - The court battle over redistricting is likely over and Congressman Henry Bonilla's 23rd district remains almost completely intact.

"I've become very attached to the people of the 23rd district. We work well together and have supported one another for the past nine years. I'm thrilled that I'll continue representing them, hopefully for many years to come," said Mr. Bonilla.

A three-judge federal district panel issued an order today adopting new congressional districts for Texas. After close review, Mr. Bonilla's district looks largely the same.
