single districts. Currently, only one minority serves on the six member city council. The seven member school board doesn't have any minorities serving.

# Several Varieties Of Squash Available During Summer <br> SOUTHWESTERN SQUASH 

by Carla mckeown Squash was one of those foods
that, as a child, I never knew that, as a child, I never knew
whether I should like or not. It was a food that most grown-ups liked, automatically
kids didn't like.
However, my mother cooked home-grown crook-neck yellow squash in the summer, sprinkled it with salt and pepper and topped it
with pats of butter. Now with pats of butter. Now, put
butter on something and I just can't seem to say "no."
It took a little more coaxing to convince me that zucchini was good. But now I enjoy all kinds of sque term summer squash typically refers to soft-skinned squash that traditionally were available only in the summer. However, today most squash straightneck and crook-neck, zucchini and pattypan.

peaks form. Fold the egg whites into the egg yolk mixture. Layer half the squash in the bottom of a 12-inch-by-8-inch greased baking

over the squash and sprinkle with half the cheese and all of the bacon. Repeat with the remaining squash, egg mixture and cheese. Combine the breadcrumbs and butter; sprinkle over the top layer. Bake at 350
degrees for 20 minutes. Makes 8 to degrees for 20
