The follies of market timing
 Many investors try to "time"
the market by "buying low and
selling high." In theory, that's selling high." In theory, that'

possible to put into practice. possible to put in outguess the
If you try to our
market, you run the substantial market, you run the substantial
risk of guessing wrong - of buyrisk of guessing wrong - of buy-
ing stocks too soon, before they ing stocks too soon, before they
get even cheaper, or of selling stocks too late, after they've
fallen from their highs. But these are only the most obvious of the problems that can result from market timing. Here are some others to consider:
$\cdot$ You could lose your invest-
ment discipline. The best inves tors are the disciplined investors. They choose quality stocks and hold them for the long term, through good and bad markets. In fact, they have conditioned
themselves to ignore short-term price swings in either direction, based on their belief that their patience eventually will be rewarded.
.You could hurt your diversification. To succeed as an in-
vestor, you need to build a diversified portfolio. Your exact mix of investments will depend on your individual goals, risk
tolerance and time horizon. Over time, as your situation. Changes - for example, when
chen you move from the working
world to retirement - you will need to adjust your portfolio.
But if you're constantly buying But if you're constantly buying
and selling in a vain attempt to time the market, you may well end up with a perennially "unbalanced" portfolio. Keep in
mind, though, that ieven a dimind, though, that even a di-
versified portfolio won't guarversified portfolio won't guar-
antee a profit, nor will it pro-
tect against a loss in a declintect against a loss in a declining market.
tion costs. Stock up transaction costs. Stock transactions
can be expensive, as you rack can be expensive, as you rack
up commissions and other fees. Over time, these costs can sig-
nificantly erode your investment returns. If you are always trying to "buy low" and "sell
high you'll be doing an awful lot of buying and selling. bill. When you sell a stock for a profit, you must pay capital
gains taxes. However, if you hold a stock for at least one year
before selling, you will be assessed the most favorable capital gains rate, which is 15 per-
cent for most investors. But if cent for most investors. But if
you were to pursue a buy low/ you were to pursue a buy low/ seme stocks before a year has
somped and pay higher capital
lapser lapsed and pay higher capital
gains rates. And if you're regains rates. And if you're re-
peatedly selling a lot of shares peatedly selling a lot of shares
in this accelerated time frame, you could face some unpleasant
surprises when it's time to file your taxes.
Clearly, the buy low/sell high approach has some major
drawbacks. So should your drawbacks. So should you ig
nore the price of a stock when you're making buy or sell deci-
sions? No - just sions? No - just look at more
than the price. If you're consid than the price. If you're consid-
ering buying a stock whose price is low, try to find out why it's low. If it's a good company in the grip of a strong "bear" market, then a low price may indeed indicate a good bargain.
But if a company's stock price
is low because its products are no longer competitive or the company itself is part of a de-
clining industry, then "buying clining industry, then "buying
low" with the hopes of eventulow with he hopes of eventu-
ally reaping big profits prob-
ably ably doessn't make much sense.
Make your investment deciMake your investment deci-
sions carefully. But until a crystal ball arrives, don't try to stay
one step ahead of the market or you could fall far behind.

## ACLEAR REPORT ABOUT DAMONDS

By Ivan the Scientist ou know what a diamond is, right?
A diamond is a really, really, really hard, transparent crystal.
Diamonds can be different colors, from see-through clear to blue, yellow or pink - and other colors, too.
What I bet you didn't know is that diamonds are formed about 100 miles ( 161 kilometers) below the Earth's surface! One hundred miles! Look at a map and see wha town is 100 miles from you.

## Then picture that distance

 straight down!One hundred miles deep in the earth is where you'll find melted rock and the right amounts of pressure and heat to make diamonds.
Here are some interesting facts about diamonds: - In order for a diamond to be created, carbon (remember this word!) must be placed under at least 435,113 pounds per square inch of pressure ar a temperature of ateast ( 752 degrees Fahren heit ( 400 degrees Celsius)




Think of the hottest day you can remember. Now multiply that heat about seven times and that's how hot it has to be to create a diamond!

If the temperature is not hot enough or the pressure is not strong enough to make diamonds, then graphite is formed. Graphite is a soft, black material

Most diamonds we see today were formed millions of years ago. Powerful volcanic eruptions brought them close to the surface
