Commissioners quell rumor

Kinney County Commissioners responded to a rumor about replacing Kinney County Judge Johnny Fritter at a Special Meeting on July 25.

Dr. Kent Lowery, Kinney County Republican Chairman, addressed the commissioners during the public comment portions about a rumor being circulated about replacing Fritter with current County Attorney Tully Shahan.

Lowery said he brought the rumor to the court's attention in an effort to put a stop to it and

suggested, as the Republican Chairman, that if the seat did become available the court should strongly consider having a special election because the judge's position is the most important position in our county government. Lowery added later the people (of Kinney County) should be allowed to decide this matter for themselves.

Lowery was interrupted by Precinct 3 Commissioner Nat Terrazas saying, "That rumor is false."

A brief discussion between the commissioners and audience members followed about whether or not Terrazas should

have interrupted Lowery and how much time each person should have to speak during public comment. Lowery was able to continue on and make his point about allowing the people of Kinney County to make such a decision.

Judge Fritter has been noticeably absent in recent months from the regular commissioner's court meetings and county court dates due to illness and questions about his ability to serve have surfaced.

According to Fritter, the controversy continues as the commissioners voted to reduce Fritter's pay by approximately

\$10,000 per year citing he is not adjudicating cases in county court. Fritter said he has filed a grievance and a committee is expected to be selected next week.

In an interview with Fritter, he says he believes his health will improve and he will continue to serve the citizens.

"I have no intention of resigning," said Fritter.

Jones bounces back into the game

Brackett ISD's Jones Elementary/Intermediate (Jones) campus has successfully regained a Recognized status with the Texas Education Agency (TEA).

This accomplishment comes after being deemed Academically Unacceptable due to the 2007 TAKS scores.

Jones 2008 TAKS scores significantly improved in the areas of Reading, Math and Science. Reading Scores improved from 87 percent to 97 percent. Writing scores stayed at 97 percent. Math improved from 73 percent to 88 percent and most importantly, Science improved from 31 percent to 83 percent for the campus overall.

Jones' Principal Alma Gutierrez praised the hard work by all members of the campus by stating, "I am not surprised at our Academic Accountability Rating, given the dedication and effort put forth by our faculty, staff, students and parents. We will continue to strive for excellence."

New ownership reopens the local beverage barn after two years of closed doors

Micheal J. Stroff, IV, cohost of "Southern Outdoor Experience (SOE) Television" recently purchased the beverage barn on Hwy 90 in Brackettville.

The beverage barn, closed for two years now, reopened on July 29.

Stroff, an expert in the outdoor industries, decided to purchase the barn after relocating his various business operations to Kinney County. Stroff sees the beverage barn as a viable business both he and the community can benefit from. The barn will employ approximately a half dozen people.

In addition to his popular hunting show, Stroff's other business interests include the SOE Ranch, previously known as the Chapman Ranch, located on Nueces River Road in Kinney County and working with his

family's commercial hunting operations in North Carolina, South Carolina, Maine, Minnesota and now in Texas.

Over the last year Stroff has also been working with Fort Clark Springs Association to supervise their managed hunts. Stroff will be implementing the hunts according to FCS's own Wildlife Management Plan designed by a special committee.

Stroff started in the outdoor business with managing and being part owner of the Black River Plantation in South Carolina and plans to expand his enterprise here in Kinney County.

Gutierrez also stated, "The campus' nine new teachers thus far, are preparing to continue the recognized rating and aim their efforts towards an exemplary rating."

According to TEA, a Recogn-

nized status may be achieved with a passing rate of 75 percent for all student groups evaluated on all Texas Assessments of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS) exams.

TEA also pointed out the 2008 scores proved to have a drop in the number of those dis-

tricts and/or campuses with an Academically Unacceptable rating but Mathematics and Science continue to be the most common areas that cause districts and campuses to have the unacceptable rating.

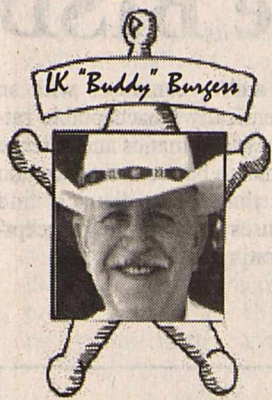

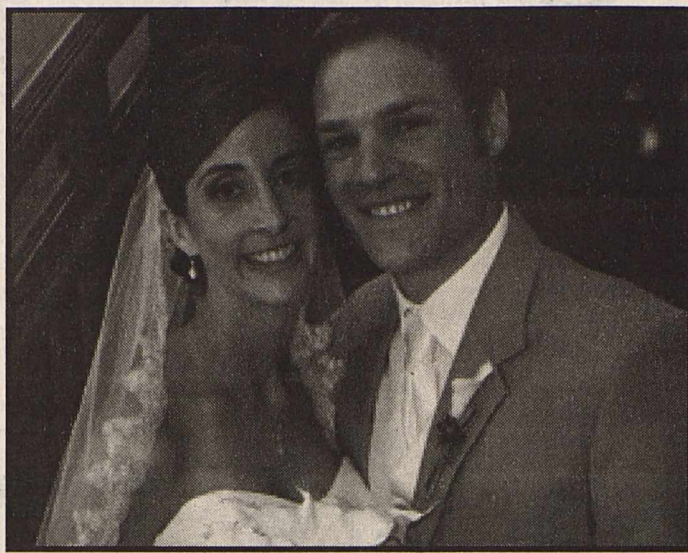
