Stabbing leaves man hospitalized

A Brackettville man was stabbed in the abdomen, but law enforcement officials say the victim claims he does not know who was at fault for his injuries.

Joe Lewis Dixon, 49, known to currently be living in Brackettville, was treated by local emergency medical personnel at 9:24 p.m. on November 29 for stabbing wounds to the lower left arm and the lower left abdomen. Dixon was later transported to Val Verde Medical Center in Del Rio and then emergency airlifted to a hospital in San Antonio.

Dixon walked into the Kinney County Fire Rescue building located on Ellen Street in Brackettville and wanted medical attention for his wounds, a sheriff's incident report reads.

According to the Kinney County Sheriff's Department, a deputy was dispatched first to the EMS building where Dixon claimed he just woke up in his truck and he had been mysteriously stabbed twice. Later, after obtaining a witness statement, deputies traveled to 312 East Veltman Street in Brackettville where Richard Rene Clark, 41, was arrested for aggravated assault with a deadly weapon.

KCSO officials are still investigating the crime, but believe the two men, both heavily intoxicated, were fist fighting when Clark, who suffered from a broken nose and other minor injuries, assaulted Dixon with a knife. No drugs were confiscated at the scene,

but deputies consider it to be a possible reason for the altercation.

Dixon was questioned a second time in the hospital, but still refused to name Clark as his assailant.

Clark's bail was set at \$5,000, but at press time he still remained in lock up at the county jail.

Fort Clark photographer to show in Del Rio

Fort Clark resident and professional photographer Bob Parvin will be featured at the Firehouse Gallery this month.

Parvin, a widely published photographer and writer according to his bio, will have 25 original photos on display.

The photos, taken over a thirty year period, reflect his travels as a *Texas Highways Magazine* editor.

In one of his photos entitled "Venga" a woman gazes out of a shadowy door and with a powerful look that entices the viewer to come in. The photo reveals



the coveted colors of aged stucco that so many try to replicate in modern decorating.

The collection is aptly named "Border Walls" as Parvin has captured, "images that reflect the historical and cultural diversity of the Texas/Mexico Borderlands via the colors, contours and textures of its walls," says his show press release.

Parvin is the Director of Media and Public Relations for Sul Ross-Rio Grande College in Uvalde and has had more than 2,500 images published in every major Texas magazine. He is an advocate for preservation and his words and pictures have been used to help "the public recognize the value of irreplaceable lands and landmarks."

The "Border Walls" show will run December 5-31 at the Firehouse Gallery, 120 Garfield Street in downtown Del Rio.

The photos will be for sale with a portion of the proceeds benefiting the Del Rio Arts Council.

Trustees conclude search for new super

Brackett ISD Board of Trustees announced they have narrowed their search for a new superintendent down to one lone candidate.

"On November 25, the Brackett ISD Board of Trustees named Robert Keith Westbrook as lone finalist for the position of superintendent/CEO. He has served Texas public schools 20 years, most recently as superintendent/CEO at Grandfalls-Royalty ISD. Westbrook began his career as teacher and coach at Milano ISD. He continued serving the district as principal and interim superintendent. He has also worked at the Texas Youth Commission as an educator," read a statement released by the Texas Association of School Boards (TASB) December 1.

Brackett school board members have been searching for a new superintendent since the position was vacated by Paula Renken in September. Renken resigned her position with BISSD to take a position with Region 20 based in San Antonio.

Trustees hired Butch Felkner of TASB's Executive Search Services to help them fill the position and after a detailed process decided on Westbrook.

Felkner reports he advertised the position on two education websites popular with Texas educators looking to promote and received 18 applications from all over the state.

Felkner met with local parents, teachers and administrators in order to obtain information on what kind of superintendent the community wanted.

All 18 applications were brought before the trustees

where they cut the number down to six candidates they wanted to personally interview.

Of the six, four were interviewed and the number was then reduced down to two candidates that were actually interviewed a second time.

The board invited the top candidates and their spouses to dinner,

followed by a private follow-up interview.

"We were looking for someone who would fit in with the community to help the district blossom. I am very pleased with TASB and Mr. Felkner. He was very professional and the entire plan was well executed," said school board president John

Paul Schuster.

The search cost the district \$5,700.

TASB is the oldest and largest education search firm in Texas.

The board is scheduled to vote to hire Westbrook on December 17 at the Central Office Board Room.
