## Ward appointed to replace Fritter as judge

A new County Judge has been appointed to fill out the term recently vacated by the late Judge John Fritter.

Tim Ward was sworn in at the regular meeting of the Commissioner's Court by District Court Judge Enrique Fernandez. There were others who expressed an interest in the position but the Commissioner's elected to choose someone who could hit the ground running. Ward was County Judge from 1991-1994.

As soon as he was sworn in he conducted the meeting as though he had never left office. Many expressed approval of the appointment and wished Ward well as he finishes out the term which expires in 2010.

Haden Keyser, District Conservationist with the United States Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), spoke to the Commissioners on Monday and stated that NRCS did their five year inspection a couple of months ago on the two watershed dams here in the

county to see that they are functioning properly and that the operation maintenance agreements are being carried out. He said that the state engineer inspected the structures and while they are in good condition and not unsafe, there is brush on the embankments and in the spillway that needs to be removed. That is part of the maintenance

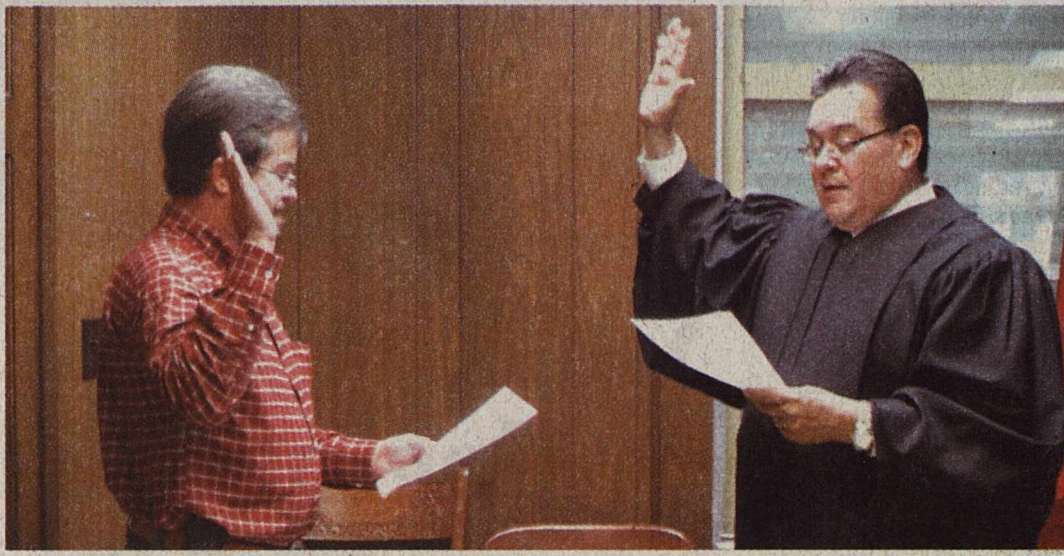
agreement that falls under the jurisdiction of the Commissioners. "There needs to be a plan of action done so we can get the finances and get that taken care of as soon as possible," said Keyser.

When Keyser was asked if the brush could be removed mechanically he said that you could not get big equipment in to clear

the embankments and that some kind of chemical would have to be used; either Ariel spray or cut and then spray the stumps. "In the spillways you could probably get a bulldozer in there to get those Mesquites out." In the past some shredding has been done, but as it only clears topical growth, the problem is still there. With

Ariel spraying the drift is always a consideration. However, with the use of a helicopter the drift is minimal. Most companies won't come out to spray less than 100 acres and this job only encompasses 50 to 55 acres. Keyser said that perhaps by word of mouth someone else in the county might need some chemical spraying done as well and thus it warrant a trip out here.

Keyser recommended that for the cost, Ariel spraying is the cheapest. "If you get a 70% kill with Ariel spraying, you are doing a very good job." He said that if we sprayed the whole area and got that chemical into the trees and let it start working, a reapplication in two to three years would get what had not been killed off with the first treatment. The window of opportunity is quickly closing and it should be done before the end of the month or the middle of August at the latest. The Commissioners made a motion to approve the necessary conservation work up to the amount budgeted for the maintenance.



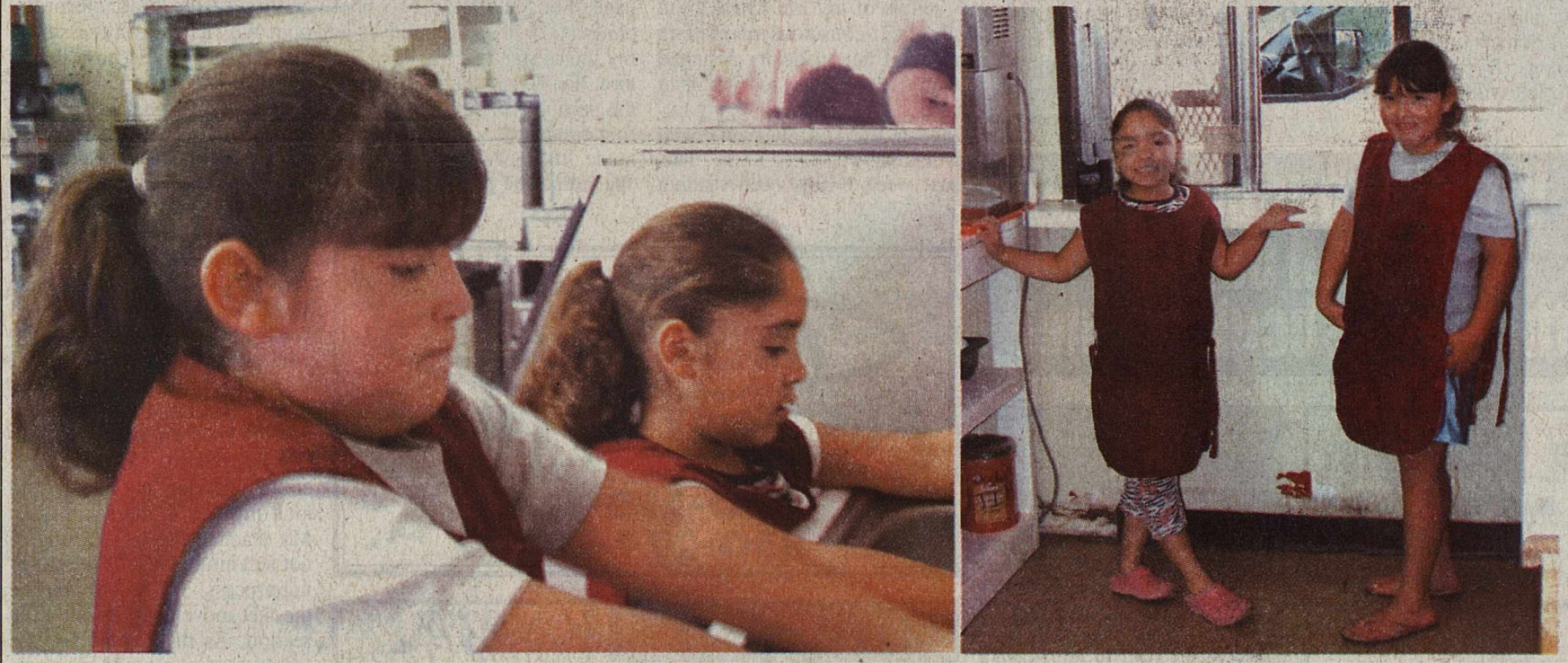

## Water in the pool or under the bridge?

The Fort Clark Springs Board of Directors held their regular meeting on Saturday, July 18.

Felix Cerna, the new Director of Operations, gave his monthly report. He received a visit from the Assistant Watermaster, Jose Lupe Luna, who is with the Rio Grande Watermaster Program. This program falls under the administration of the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ). The Watermaster Programs ensure compliance with water rights by monitoring stream flows, reservoir levels, and water use. According to Cerna, Luna said that we (Fort Clark) would probably not be able to use our swimming pool because ranchers down the creek were saying that we were "stopping the flow of Los Moras Creek down the road." Cerna was able to demonstrate that once we filled the pool up that there was no stopping of the flow. Luna suggested we only clean the pool every two weeks (which has been done in the past) and that at some point we would probably have to open up the spillway a little more to allow more water to flow down the creek. Cerna stated that after accessing the situation, the Assistant Watermaster said to "continue with the operations that you are doing now." He went on to say that if the farmers continue to complain we will

probably have to go to the two week cleaning program and to release more water; something that we will be able to do if we have to. Bill Haenn said, "The pool has absolutely no affect whatsoever, scientific, physical or anything else on the flow of the creek. In 1996 we lost the creek from the Highway 90 bridge here all the way off the property. All the fish died and everything else. It has to do with the amount of water that's being generated by the spring

not the pool; when the spring drops below the level of where it will flow into the pool we have to pay MUD \$600 each time we fill the pool. It has absolutely nothing to do with the down stream flow of water." Cerna stated that Luna expressed concerns regarding the fluctuations on the monitoring scale when we emptied the pool. However, after observing the operations he was satisfied that it did not affect the flow of the creek.

Other business on the agenda concerned a letter of intent for preliminary negotiations with the Nueces River Authority relating to acceptance of garbage from Leakey, Campwood and outlying areas of Uvalde. The cost to haul their garbage to San Antonio is too costly. The purpose of the negotiations is to discuss whether it would be feasible for the Fort to accept their garbage. There are concerns that it would shorten the life of our landfill. The board met with

the engineers a week ago Monday and they outlined what to expect from these areas and gave projections as to the life of the dump site and the cost per ton. "Presently we're paying out about, year to date, \$135,000 to \$155,000 to get our garbage hauled out. So we know this would be a tremendous savings to the Fort" said Larry O'Keefe, Chairman of the Board. Size wise the landfill is large enough to handle additional waste to reduce our costs. However the board is still waiting for more figures from the engineers as to what they recommend; what we need to charge per ton and the tonnage these entities are hauling to San Antonio now. O'Keefe stated that, "We'll definitely make it a profitable thing for the Fort; it's not going to be a give-away." A motion was made and passed to send a letter of intent to the Nueces River Authority to enter into negotiations. It passed unanimously.

Bruce Trautwein was appointed to the board to fill out the term vacated by Felix Cerna. He was sworn in by Larry O'Keefe. Following that a motion was made to appoint Sam Holloman as Vice President to the board, the position previously held by Cerna. The motion passed unanimously.

Directors Larry O'Keefe, Rick Keyes, Sam Holloman, Hattie Berleth and Bruce Trautwein were present.

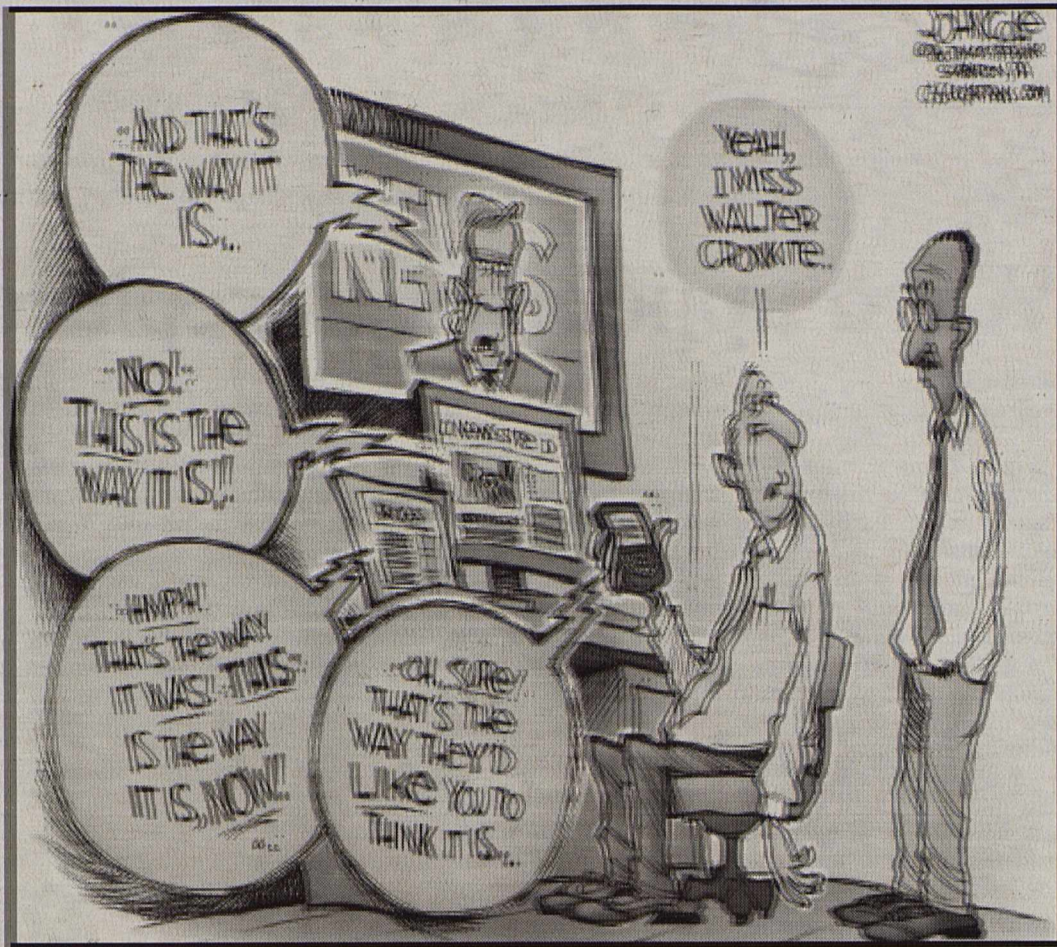

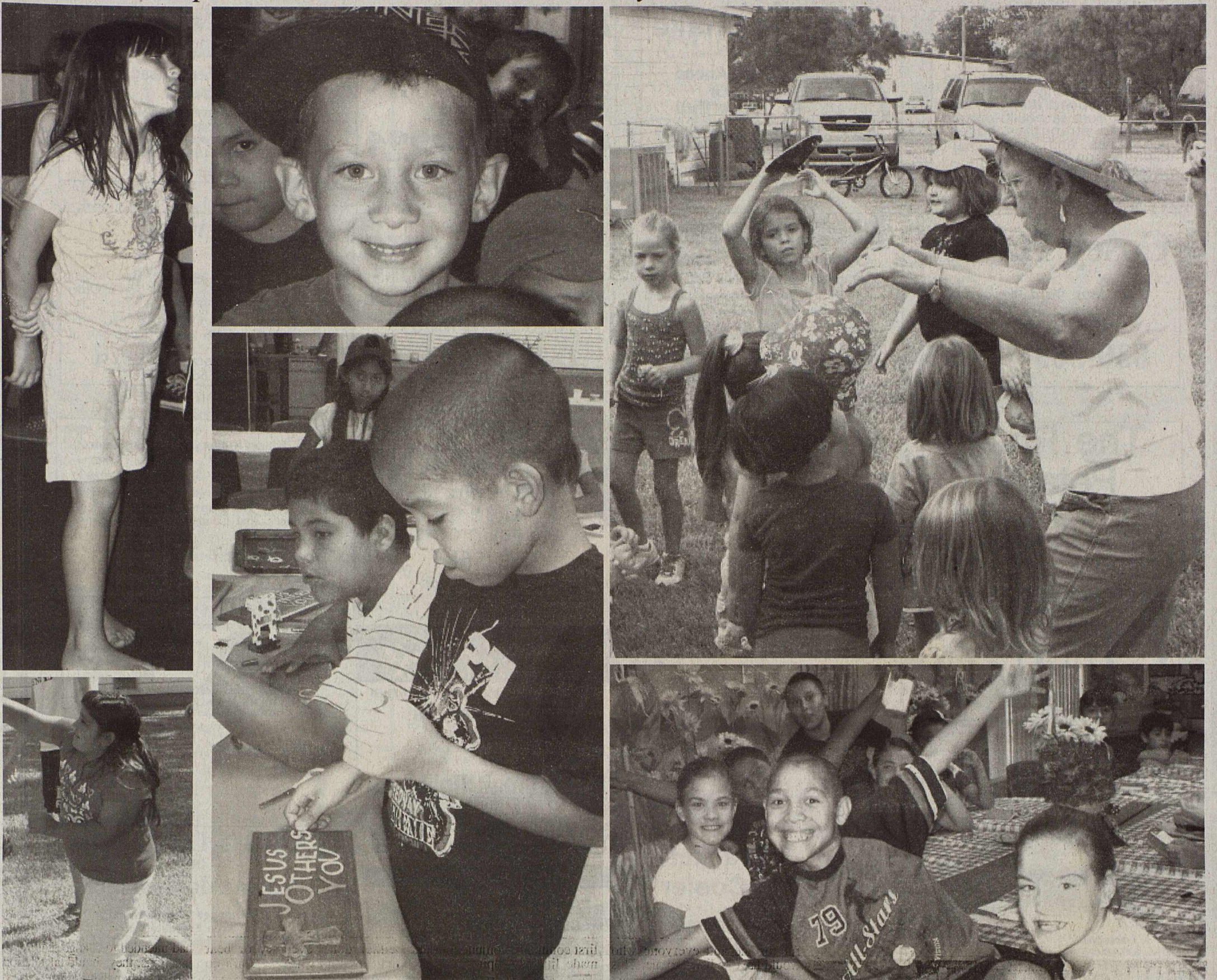

The motion was carried by all.  
Pending legal review, Henry Garcia is being considered as the active Onsite Designated Representative for the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) Onsite Sewage Facility; he is licensed as a DR and worked in that capacity in Val Verde County for about a year. According to the TCEQ online site, Designated Representatives work for an authorized agent of the TCEQ. They perform site evaluations (when it is part of their job duties), complaint investigations, system evaluations, and inspections of Onsite Sewage Facilities (OSSF's) that have been issued an authorization to construct; to ensure the OSSF has been installed to the criteria established by the TCEQ or the Authorized Agent Order approved by the TCEQ, whichever is more stringent. He is only authorized to perform these duties when he is back by an agency authorizing him to do so. The county has expressed their interest in contracting Garcia to be the county Onsite DR. Garcia has offered his services at no cost to the county, however, as he is the City Manager and an employee of the city of Brackettville, he could not speak for the city as to whether they would want to charge a fee as any services required by the county would most likely coincide with his normal business hours for the city. Garcia was asking the county for the authority to proceed to resolve any legal issues that might impede his offer to act as the DR. The Commissioners made a motion to that effect and it passed unanimously.  
The commissioners discussed action to the proposed tax rate-budget preparation calendar. Projected income for the ensuing year is way

down. The Commissioners will be having a Budget Workshop for the fiscal year 2009-2010.  
The burn ban has been reinstated and is effective immediately for a period of 90 days.

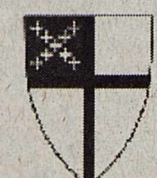
