Fort Clark and San Felipe Country Club agree to play nice

Ron Chatter, a representative of the San Felipe Country Club spoke before the regularly scheduled meeting of the Fort Clark Springs Board of Directors on Saturday. Prior to the presentation to the membership, he had met with General Manager, Felix Cerna and Golf Director, Don Lee, regarding a reciprocal agreement between Fort Clark Springs and San Felipe Country Club. As stated in a letter to the directors, for no extra fees or dues from either club, the golf members of San Felipe will be allowed to play the Fort Clark golf course for cart fees only and golf members of Fort Clark will be allowed to play the San Felipe golf course for cart fees only. Golf members will also have full use of San Felipe's Club House and

club facilities, including: the tennis courts, fitness room, locker rooms, swimming pool, dining room, bar, banquet room and meeting room. Resident members of Fort Clark who are non-golfers, will be given a Social Membership at a cost of \$20 per month; affording them use of the facilities mentioned above. As Social Members they may play golf for the standard rates at San Felipe. Fort Clark members that would like to use the San Felipe facilities will be asked to fill out a special "Fort Clark Springs" application and will be given a San Felipe Country Club Golf or Social Membership Card. Any purchases made at San Felipe's restaurant, bar or pro-shop may be paid for at the time of purchase or may be charged to the Member's Club Account. Fort Clark "Social Members"

will be sent a monthly bill for \$20 plus any purchases as described above. Fort Clark "Golf Members" will only be sent a monthly bill if they make purchases during the month. In reference to the Country Club facilities, Ron said, "Besides being a bar and a restaurant, it's a fun time as there are scheduled activities at least once a month and sometimes two or three times a month. It's a good place for birthday parties and anniversary parties." October events include a Three Club Golf Championship, Sunday Gourmet Brunch, Halloween Costume Party with Buffet Dinner, a hay ride and of course, ghost stories. Dickman Hall has been nominated by the Kinney County Historical Commission to be considered for application for an official Texas Historical Marker. A letter from the His-

torical Commission mentioned several of the buildings on Fort Clark for consideration for such a marker. Bruce Trautwein made the motion and said, "The Kinney County Historical Commission sent us a letter and mentioned several of our buildings for consideration for an official Texas Historical Marker. The Building Restoration and Preservation Committee and the Friends of Fort Clark Historical Society have recommended that Dickman Hall be the building for nomination." The motion passed unanimously. Although this action will cost the Fort a nominal amount, the tax breaks will outweigh that cost in the long run. Talks continue regarding a proposed assisted living facility on the Fort. The board voted to continue to support the assisted living project pending the agreement on the exact location,

the annual lease assessment amount and determination of the removal of eight acres from the restricted land use document. According to director Holloman, "The location will be determined in part on an opinion by the Texas Department of Transportation relating to traffic entering Highway 90 from the facility. The annual dollar amount of the lease would have to be negotiated in order to protect the best interests of the association. Finally, a thorough examination of the Restricted Land Use document and how this would affect our property taxes since undeveloped club grounds have been placed under recreation park and scenic land category in order to save on our property taxes." Directors O'Keefe, Keyes, Holloman, Trautwein and Berleth were present.

Road work begins in Spofford

Carl Esser of Esser and Company located in Uvalde, reported to the Commissioners Court that the road work in Spofford is coming right along. The construction company on site is Glen Fuqua Construction Company. "They have initiated the work and have completed all the conduits (casings) they were putting in prior to the implementation of the actual paving process." These casings are for future development; they will accommodate water lines or any utilities the city of Spofford may require. Kinney County Judge Tim Ward drew the court's attention to four benches located in the court house lobby. The 1891 benches were in the original court house which was first located in what is the Masonic Lodge building today. The oak benches in the lobby have been restored to their original splendor and present quite a contrast to their mates located in the County Court room and to those

in the District Court room which were constructed to fit the present court house. Two positions are now open on the board of directors for the Kinney County Appraisal District. Two individuals expressed an interest in serving and filling those positions, Tim Ward and Bobby Voss. The school district is the largest collector of taxes in Kinney County, followed by the Kinney County, the City of Brackettville and the City of Spofford. Each of the aforementioned entities is entitled to cast their votes for the nominees however they would like to. The County Auditor was not present due to health issues and requested that Commissioners Court recess until Tuesday afternoon to consider requests for Departmental Budget Adjustments and to review, revise and/or amend the 2008-09 and or 2010 budget as needed. Court adjourned at 11am. Judge Ward and directors Massingill, Montalvo, Dodson and Melancon were present.

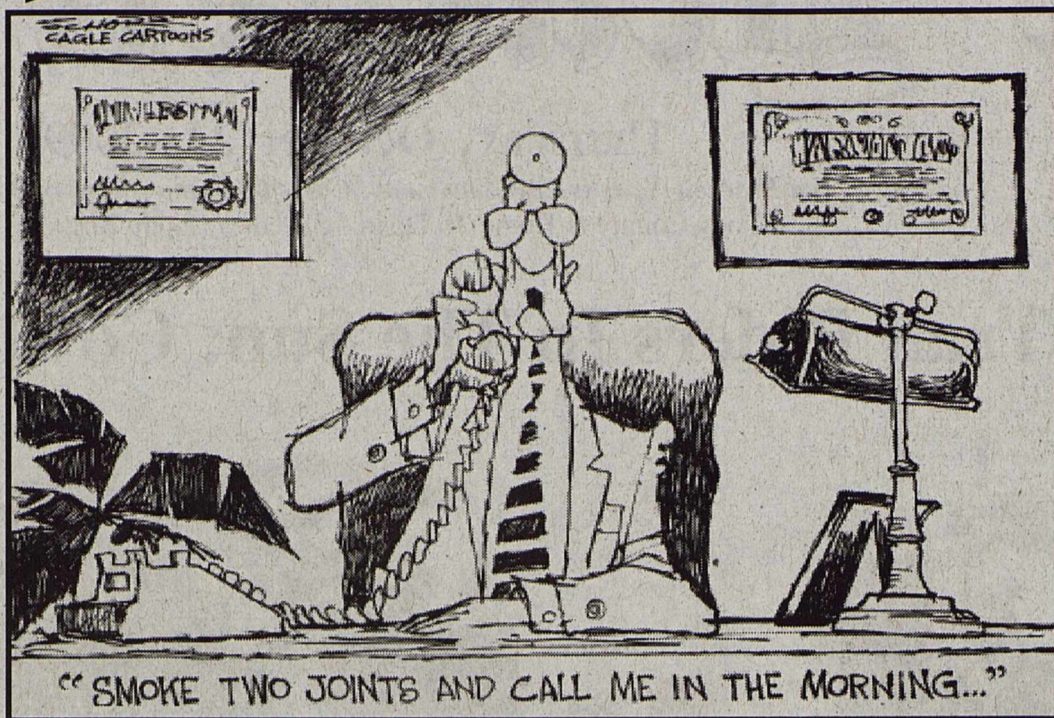

When you hear those nasty words come out of your mouth: I DON'T HAVE TIME!!! I want you to set your timer for 15 minutes and do something! You do have time!

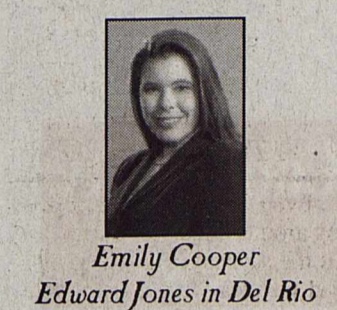
We all have the same amount of time in a day and it is how we choose to use it that makes the difference. When your perfectionism clouds your thinking you forget to do just a little to make things better.

Keep inflation in mind when investing

As an investor, you're always aware of the potential effects of market volatility on your portfolio. But you also need to pay attention to another factor that could impact your investments' return — inflation.

If you look back over the last few decades, you might not think inflation is much of a threat. Since the double-digit rates of the early 1980s, inflation has fallen significantly and, for the most part, has stayed low. Still, over time even a mild annual inflation rate can eventually erode your purchasing power.

Obviously, if you're a retiree, or close to retiring, you need to plan for the impact of inflation on your income stream, which may, to a large degree, depend on the types of investments you own.

But even if you're at an earlier stage in life, you need to think about inflation because it can reduce the "real" rate of return you receive on your investments.

In any case, you can find investments that may be able to help you cope with inflation. When you own stocks, for example, you've got an ownership stake in companies that have the ability to raise prices — which make them effective inflation-fighting investments. Keep in mind an investment in stocks fluctuates and you can lose your money.

But one of the biggest inflation-fighting benefits of stocks is the dividends that they may pay. Well-run companies may reward investors by paying them back with dividends — and some companies have increased their dividends annually for decades. A word of caution, though: Companies can reduce or eliminate them at any time, without notice. In fact, during the long market slump we experienced, some companies did cut back on their dividend payments.

Not all stocks pay dividends, of course. In any case, if you're going to maintain a balanced portfolio, you'll also want to own other types of investments, such as bonds. But many bonds — along with other fixed-income vehicles, such as Certificates of Deposit — are not good "inflation fighters" because the fixed rate of return they offer simply may not keep up with inflation. However, if you built a "bond ladder" — that is, a group of bonds with varying maturities — you'd have more flexibility in combating inflation, because your longer-term bonds typically offer higher interest rates. What about the so-called "inflation hedges," such as commodities and real estate?

Actually, these "hedges" are extremely volatile and should be approached with great caution. You need look no further back than the bursting of the housing "bubble" to see that real estate, for instance, can go down just as fast as it goes up — and once down, it can take years to recover.

In your efforts to invest wisely for the future, inflation is only one of the variables you need to consider.

But it can be an important one — so make sure you choose the investments that both address inflation and can help you make progress toward all your financial goals.

Brackett Tigers vs Medina

Even with the enhanced parking around Tiger Stadium nearly all the spaces were taken, and I had no idea why. I know there are only a handful of home football games each year, but even so the turnout seemed unusually heavy, so I had to walk around a bit and see what the fuss was about.

When I came into the stadium I saw (among other things) black and gold balloons, alumni (hmm) and the Homecoming Court, all indications that a Homecoming is underway, or at least being contemplated. That, and I heard the word "homecoming" over the P.A. system about

half a dozen times. So that was it! I had come in expecting a football game and wandered into a homecoming, also. There was a game that night too, and a good one at that. Not competitive, mind you, but a tonic for the Brackett fans who saw their team get tattooed last week in D'Hanis.

The Tigers racked up nearly 600 yards rushing in a 48-7 rout of the Medina Bobcats. That's not a misprint, by the way. 300 yards is considered a good game, even for a team that runs as much as Brackett does. 600 yards sends team historians to the record books to look for comparable past performances. It was 35-7 at the half, and Medina's only score of the night came on a fluke kickoff return that resulted in a touchdown-in fact, it looked a bit like the Immaculate Reception.

For the record, Brackett had just scored the second of its seven touchdowns, and kicked off to Medina's Andy Langley.

Langley made it about ten yards and got rocked by a host of Tiger defenders. The ball popped out of his hands and into the hands of a nearby Bobcat lineman, who caught it in full stride and raced into the end zone. Oddly enough, linemen can be effective ball-handlers in these situations. That's because they don't trust themselves with the football. They're profoundly uncomfortable with it, and so they want to deliver it to its intended destination as quickly as possible.

The Tiger backfield returned nearly intact on Friday night after a bout with the flu the week before (half the team seemed to have had it, even a lot of the guys who suited up last week at D'Hanis) and the week off seemed to do them good. Cody Clark, Brandon Allen and Victor Robledo all ran well, and the defense was dominant. Next up for the Tigers is Nueces Canyon, Friday night at 7:30.

What kind of scary music do you think of around Halloween? Some think of the "The Monster Mash" written by Bobby Pickett as THE Halloween Song. As a child Bobby Pickett grew up hanging out in movie the-

atres. He wanted to be a movie actor following his hero, Boris Karloff. After serving in the Army he moved to Hollywood where he started a band, the Cordials.

He could do a great Karloff impersonation, and would sometimes break into during his songs. One of his fellow band members talked him into writing a song about monsters. Using the genre of the day, dance songs like the "mashed potato", he came up with "The Monster mash". In August of 1962, the

song was recorded in one take, but no record label would pick it up. Not to be discouraged Bobby pressed 100 records of the song and drove them around to radio stations.

The song was an instant success. It shot to number 1 in just 8 weeks. It was of only a few songs to hit the top 100 three different times. It has stood the test of time as a Halloween classic! "Monster Mash" trivia-Elvis hated the song. It was played to awaken US astronauts by NASA around Halloween. Boris Karloff himself loved the song and performed it on the October 30, 1965 episode of *Shindig*.

Phantom of the Opera trivia- Though not mentioned in the movie, the Phantom's name is Erik. It takes about 4 hours for the Phantom's mask and makeup to be applied.
