



> How the animal is mounted is often determined by space or tion and skill, Carmen can build the scene from the ground up. Making use of materials such as lumber, chicken wire, plaster their natural surroundings such as dirt, rocks, and plant life, Carmen creates a setting so real Mother Nature could not tell the difference. One such scene was recently on display in Del Rio at Sutherlands. She posed two Aoudad Sheep on a rocky outcropping that looked to have weighed thousands of pounds but in fact it weighed less than 300. That particular piece will be on display permanently at a bank in Lufkin, Texas. Carmen says that building the scene is "her time". It gives her the opportunity to freely express her

yeasty talent. Once a client takes possession of the mount, he can proudly display the result of the hunt. Little care is required to maintain the integrity of the mount because of the way the hide is tanned and cured. Carmen does not limit herself to mounting mammals; she also mounts fish and birds. She ships worldwide; most recently she shipped a buffalo to Africa. The freighter company handles all of the export paperwork; certain types of shipping crates are required. From beginning to end the process is quite an undertaking; a challenge this little lady successfully met.

This could be a scandal of epic proportions and one that makes Nixon's Watergate or Clinton 's Monica Lewinsky affair pale by comparison. Why was there neither rhyme nor reason as to which dealerships of the Chrysler Corporation were to be closed? Roll the clock back to the weeks just before Chrysler declared bankruptcy. Chrysler, like GM, was in dire financial straights and federal government graciously offered to "buy the company" and keep them out of bankruptcy and "save jobs." Chrysler was, in the words of Obama and his administration, "Too big to fail," same story with GM. The feds organized their "Automotive Task Force" to fix Chrysler and GM. Obama, in an act that is 100% unconstitutional, appointed a guy named Steve Ratmer to be the White House's official Car Czar-literally, that's what his title is. Rattner is the liaison between Obama, Chrysler, and GM. Initially, the national media reported that Chrysler had made this list of dealerships. That is not true. Amazingly, of the 789 dealerships closed by the federal government 788 had donated money, exclusively, to Republican political causes, while contributing nothing to Democratic political causes. The only "Democratic" dealership on the list was found to have donated \$7,700 to Hillary's campaign, and a bit over \$2,000 to John Edwards. This same dealership, reportedly, also gave \$200.00 to Obama's campaign. Does that seem a little odd to you? Steve Rattner, the guy who put the list together. Well he happens to be married to a babe named Maureen White. Maureen happens to be the former national finance chairman of the Democratic National Committee. As such, she would have access to campaign donation records from everyone in the nation, Republican or Democrat. But of course, this is just a wacky coincidence, we're certain. Then comes another really wacky coincidence. On that list of dealerships being closed down, a weird thing happened in Arkansas , North Louisiana , and Southern Missouri . Eight dealerships located near the dealerships owned by McClarty and Johnson were ordered shut down. Thus, by pure luck, these two major Obama supporters now have virtual monopoly on Chrysler sales in their zone. Isn't that amazing? Go look in The Washington Examiner, the story's there, and it's in a dozen or so other web-based news organization, this isn't being made up. Now if you thought Chrysler was owned by Fiat, you are truly mistaken. Under the federal court ruling, 65% of Chrysler is now owned by the federal government and the United Auto Worker's union- Fiat owns 20%. The other 15% is till privately owned and presumably will be traded on the stock market. Obama smiles and says he doesn't want to run the auto industry. As horrifying as this is to comprehend, and being as how this used to be the United States of America, it would appear that the president has the power to destroy private businesses and eliminate upwards of 100,000 jobs, just because they don't agree with his political agenda. There are voices in Washington demanding an explanation, but the "Automotive Task Force" has released no information to the public or any of the senators demanding answers for what has been done. You might not see it on your calendar, but Oct. 18 - 24 is National Save for Retirement Week. This event, endorsed by Congress, is designed to promote the benefits of saving for retirement and to encourage workers to take full advantage of their employer-sponsored retirement plans so you may want to use this week as a starting point to do just that. For many of us, the need to boost our retirement savings is critical. In fact, some 53 percent of Americans report that the total value of their household's savings and investments, excluding the value of their primary home and any defined benefit plans, is less than \$25,000, according to the 2009 Retirement Confidence Survey, sponsored by the Employee Benefit Research Institute. Also, the decline

reason that saving for retirement has become such a major issue. From 1986 to 2008, participation in defined benefit plans among full-time workers in private industry declined from 76 percent to 24 percent, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. In many cases, these defined benefit plans have been replaced by defined contribution plans, such as 401(k) plans which means that much of the responsibility of adequately funding retirement has shifted from the employer to the individual. Given these factors, it's clear that you must be proactive in building resources to achieve the retirement lifestyle you've envisioned. So, consider taking the following steps: ·Contribute to your 401(k) or possible, try to put in as much as you can afford to your 401(k) or other tax-advantaged, employersponsored plan, such as a 403(b) or 457(b). 



of the greatest composers of all time, but during his lifetime, he was little-known and was mostly recognized for performing on the organ. Bach composed in many established musical forms, including, for example, the cantata and fugue, and developed them into complex and sublime pieces. He was one It became famous as mystery music in the 1962 silent movie "Phantom of the Opera". Its haunting tune was also used in Disney's 'Fantasia". Ask anyone from that era "Who you gonna call?", and you will always get the same answer- Ghostbusters! After showing the movie to the producer without any sound he was told it was not scary. It was at this point that he became determined to "save it with the music". What it means: A Texas law passed in 1959 guaranteeing public access to the beaches would be enshrined into the state Constitution by this amend-

Proposition 10

What it says: The constitutional amendment to provide that elected members of the governing boards of emergency services districts may serve terms not to exceed four years.

What it means: Would increase the terms of emergency service board districts from two years to four under state law.

Proposition 11

What it says: The constitutional amendment to prohibit the taking, damaging, or destroying of private property for public use unless the action is for the ownership, use, and enjoyment of the property by the State, a political subdivision of the State, the public at large, or entities granted the power of eminent






