
Las Moras Tournament



As God is my witness, they're not going to lick me. I'm going to live through this and when it's all over, I'll never be hungry again."



much compass and harmony so are one of the more durable wood notched at intervals and played with a sounding stick.

Wind instruments were flutes made from bone, or dried cactus skeletons. Pairs of reed cylinders, lashed together with twine and placed in an infant's grave, have been interpreted as a panpipe. Along the Texas coast bird bone flutes of all shapes and sizes have been found.

Rhythmic music, and especially percussion, has long been recognized as one means of attaining the altered states of consciousness that were an important part of many Native American religions. The Caddos have endeavored to preserve their traditional music, making records that are available to the general public. The Kikapoos, are reluctant to discuss their music, which is handed down from generation to generation, thus maintaining its ceremonial importance.
