Former city chief flashes badge; gets arrested

Thomas Nemia was arrested for false identification as a peace officer on Tuesday, September 21.

Nemia, a resident of Fort Clark Springs, is believed to have, "on or about the 22nd day of May, 2010, in the County of Kinney, State of Texas, Thomas Nemia did then and there provide to Verne Childress, Sr. a badge bearing an insignia of a law enforcement agency that identified the said Thomas Nemia as a peace officer and the said Thomas Nemia knew that he, the person so identified by the said badge bearing an insignia of law enforcement agency, was no then and there commissioned as

peace officer as indicated on said badge," read court documents filed September 20.

Details as to why Nemia presented himself as a peace officer were not available at press time, but this is not the first time Nemia has been accused of falsely identifying himself as a peace officer.

As reported by this newspaper in June, 2009, Gina Terrazas arrived at her workplace and as she exited her vehicle, she was approached and told by Nemia that he was going to throw her jail for speeding.

Nemia was hired as the City of Brackettville's Police Chief in early 2009, but was soon re-

named as an "administrative chief" after it was discovered he had not been a certified police officer in over 23 years.

"I was pulling into work and drove through the parking lot and parked as usual. As I got out of the car Thomas Nemia got out of the City's car and said, 'Is there any reason for you to be going that fast in these streets?'" the complaint filed by Terrazas read.

Terrazas recounts how she was shocked by the Nemia's loudness and tone and when she asked Nemia how fast she was going, he replied, "You were going 45."

Terrazas then asked if he had "clocked" her and he replied,

"Yeah."

Terrazas asked him how he could do something like that and he said it was not that hard to clock someone.

The News confirmed the car being used by Nemia was not equipped with any radar equipment and his resume did not detail any training in alternative methods of "clocking" speeding vehicles.

Terrazas said she asked Nemia for his identification and he held a badge up to within six inches of her face.

"He said that this time he would give me a warning but the next time I was speeding in his streets he was going to put me in jail," she said in her state-

The first citizen of Kinney County

I consider myself a "novice" historian of Texas history and especially of Kinney County. There is much to discover about this "gold mine" of history where I grew up. I have loved Texas history from my first "official" introduction to it by Mrs. Jay Lee Ballantyne my fourth grade teacher who molded the minds and lives of so many of her students. She made learning fun and alive, and most of all "hands on". Thank you Mrs. Ballantyne!

Who was the first European or "white man" to live in the area now known as Kinney County? I had always assumed the first Europeans to live in Kinney County were the colonists who attempted to establish Villa de Dolores Beales which was a Spanish land grant colony on Las Moras Creek in 1834. They were a group of fifty-nine emigrants from Ireland, France and Germany who were led by Doctor Charles Beales. Fraught with drought and Indian attacks and the extreme distance from other settlements the colony failed in 1836 when Santa Anna

invaded Texas to drive the Anglos out. It was not until the establishment of Fort Clark in 1852 that white settlers were able to live in this area on a continuing basis until present day.

According to historical accounts from the Spanish governor of Coahuila, Mexico which was a Spanish territory at the time, the first European to live in the area now known as Kinney County was a Frenchman named Jean Henri. His name has also been spelled Yan Jerri, Jean Jarri and Jean Gery. I will use Yan Jarri as this was the name recorded by Captain Alonzo De Leon when Jarri was discovered living in present day Kinney County in 1688. I happened across the story of Yan Jarri while researching an incident that occurred at Fort Clark in a blog. It mentioned a white man who was the king of an Indian village and he changed history for Texas, Spain, France, Mexico and The U.S.A.

This is one story I had never heard. Yan Jarri was a member of Rene Robert Cavalier Sieur de La Salle's tragic expedition to establish a colony sixty leagues inland from the mouth

of the Mississippi River. LaSalle began his trek with four ships, one hundred French soldiers and one hundred and eighty adventurous French colonists willing to tackle the unknown perils of the New World. The four ships were the French navy escort ship Joly, the bark Belle, the store-ship Aimable and the ketch Saint Francois. Spain was at war with France when LaSalle's band embarked on this journey. Two weeks later the war ended. Unfortunately they never learned this important bit of information. They were forced to stop in Rochefort, a French seaport on the European Atlantic coast for repairs to the Joly. They also made port at Petit Goave (Haiti) presumably to restock. From there they continued into the Gulf of Mexico which was controlled by the Spanish armada and then onward to the Texas coast.

La Salle is a well known historical figure with an incredible life story too long to tell in this short dissertation. LaSalle was born in 1643 and was shot and killed on March 19, 1687 in Texas near the Trinity River by Pierre Duhaunt who was a dis-

gruntled follower of his on this ill-fated expedition. His Texas expedition was an attempt to establish a warm water port for the Mississippi River fur trade and to block English expansion as well as to inflict damage on Spanish shipping in the Gulf of Mexico. His intended destination was near Lake Saint Joseph in present day Louisiana near the Taensa Indians whom he had befriended in his previous expedition.

LaSalle sailed from La Rochelle, France on July 24, 1684 and finally made land in Texas on February 20, 1685 at Matagorda Bay. This was a seven month voyage and it must have been grueling. They thought they were near the mouth of the Mississippi so they built a base of operations they dubbed Fort St. Louis. Hardly a true fort, it consisted of six structures reportedly built on Garcitas Creek in present day Victoria County. Archeologists have not been able to prove this is the correct location as some believe it to be located on the Lavaca River in Jackson County. The sturdiest part of the compound was built nearest

to the creek and was constructed of timbers from the store-ship Amiable. The Amiable had been shipwrecked in Cavallo Pass which was the entrance to Matagorda Bay. Reportedly this main structure of the fort had a gabled roof with attic storage and four rooms at ground level. The walls were four varas high. A Spanish vara is thirty-three and a third inches long so the outside walls would have been about eleven feet high. The other five structures were not very large and were built of posts that were covered with mud and had buffalo hides for roofs. An herb garden as well as a small field of corn had been planted as well. This description was reported by Captain Alonso De Leon the Spanish explorer and governor of Coahuila who located Fort Saint Louis because of Yan Jarri.


The rigors of the voyage across the Atlantic and Gulf of Mexico as well as the building of the fort were devastating. More than half of the party died due to disease, overwork, Indian

On September 21st the JV and Varsity Volleyball teams took on the Harper Lady Horns.




On September 25th, the teams started District play against the Charlotte Lady Trojans.

The first citizen of Kinney County

attacks and malnutrition. The ketch Saint Francois was captured by Spanish privateers after leaving Haiti. The Joly returned to France shortly after Fort Saint Lewis was built taking its crew as well as the crew of the Aimable that was wrecked entering Matagorda Bay. The engineer Minuet and several other disgruntled colonists also returned to France on the Joly. In late winter of 1686 the last ship, the bark Belle was shipwrecked on the Matagorda Peninsula during a storm. (Belle was found in 1995 by archeologists from the Texas Historical Commission and was excavated over a nine month period completed in 1997 at a cost of over two million dollars. See the web link <http://www.texasbeyondhistory.net/belle/>) By January of 1687, just three years later there were just over twenty men, women and children left alive at Fort Saint Lewis. Four men were found living among the Tejas Indians and six members of LaSalle's last expedition continued on to Canada after he was murdered.

After the fort was built La Salle sent expeditions out in an attempt to locate the intended site on the Mississippi River and to establish the location in which they were located. It is reported he explored as far west as the Pecos River near present day Langtry, Texas. He also ventured to the Trinity River to the east. It was probably on the western expedition that Yan Jarri probably wandered off and got lost, or deserted, or was banished by La Salle to the wilderness that is now Kinney County. We will never know for sure why he was in Kinney County as late as May 30, 1688 when he was discovered by the Spanish. It is evident he may have been in Kinney County as early as 1685 or 1686 as this is the time frame La Salle explored the western region of Texas. He was there long enough to befriend the local Coahuiltecan Indians and become their king.

The governor of Coahuila, Mexico was Captain Alonso De Leon a noted Spanish explorer, outdoorsman and soldier. He

was later credited with helping to establish the Spanish Mission system in Texas as well as helping to blaze the Old Spanish Trail. De Leon had been getting reports that the French had established a settlement or fort somewhere along the Gulf coast in Texas. Even though the war was over between France and Spain, the Spanish were still fearful of a French lead uprising of the local Indians and then claiming Texas as a French territory. De Leon went on four expeditions searching for this fort 1686 to 1689. His third expedition in May of 1688 was due to reports that a white man was living among the Indians in a temporary settlement called a "Rancheria" north of the Rio Grande. One report says Alonso De Leon had a Spanish monk as well as about 100 soldiers with him when he left the Spanish fort at present day Monclova, Mexico. They crossed the Rio Grande reportedly near present day Eagle Pass, Texas and followed Indian trails leading to the north. After a few days of traveling along these trails they saw approximately a thousand Indians lined up in what appeared to be European military formation in front of a village. The location of this village is thought to be near the Anacacho Mountain range about fifteen miles southeast of Brackettville. One reports the village as being near Las Moras Spring now the current location of Fort Clark. De Leon was able to make contact with the Indians without incident and asked to be taken to their chief. He was led by the Indians to a large lodge covered with buffalo hides that was guarded by forty men with bows and arrows. The Spanish were astonished to see European style furniture as well as a naked white man sitting on a throne like chair. When the Indian King saw the monk with De Leon he got off his throne and knelt before the monk and said loudly, "Me Francés! Me Católico!" or in English "I'm French, I'm Catholic!" He gave his name as Jean Henri and De Leon later recorded it as Yan Jarri. Yarri's age was estimated to be around fifty. De Leon told Jarri a large

Spanish army was with him and was able to convince Jarri to go back to Monclova with him. During interrogations by De Leon and later in Mexico Jarri became confused and often gave conflicting answers to the point of appearing mentally deranged. However, he did not stray from claiming that he had come from a French fort on a big river to the east. By this time the Spanish were convinced Jarri was demented but decided to err on the side of caution and undertook a fourth expedition on March 27, 1689 with one hundred and fourteen men which included soldiers, servants, mule tenders, a monk and of course Yan Jarri as the guide to search for the elusive French fort. Once the expedition crossed the Guadalupe River Jarri began to recognize landmarks and was able to communicate with the natives in the area. He led the group to the Lavaca-Matagorda Bay region and showed them where he had landed with "Monsieur Felipe de la Gala". Shortly thereafter he led them to Fort St. Louis on April 20 or 22, 1869. The long search for the French fort had finally ended.

Unfortunately, about Christmas of 1688 the few remaining members of La Salle's group living at the site except for five children had been massacred by Karankawa Indians who pretended to befriend them. Madame Barbier who gave birth to the first white child of record born in Texas was saved temporarily by some of the Indian women but both mother and baby were killed when the Indian men found them. Listed among the survivors were the Talon children and Eustace Breman, the paymaster's son. They were adopted into the Indian tribe and were later rescued by the Spanish. One of the survivors, Jean-Baptiste Talon who was nine

years old at the time of the massacre gave the only eyewitness account. There were still rumors as late as 1717 that members of La Salle's expedition were still living among the Indians of Texas.

Yan Jarri's ultimate fate is not entirely clear but it is known that De Leon returned to Monclova and then sent Jarri to the Rio Grande to meet with members of the Tejas Indian tribe. That is the last recorded evidence other than a letter De Leon wrote a year later while on an expedition to his wife. In that letter De Leon says, "On this journey I sorely missed the old Frenchman, because of his knowledge of all the Indian languages of the region. He was always found faithful. Only with his help was it possible to discover the settlement he came from." It is presumed Yan Jarri died before De Leon left on this expedition.

Yan Jarri, the first European to live in what is known as Kinney County is a fascinating story! He lived and lived well as the King of the Indians one hundred and forty-six years before Beales's colony and one hundred and sixty-two years before Fort Clark was established. Who would have thought the first European to live in Kinney County would have been a Frenchman in 1685 who was also King of the Indians? It is long past overdue that we recognize Yan Jarri as the first European citizen of Kinney county.

Definitions: A **ketch** is a sailing craft with two masts: a main mast, and a shorter mizzen mast abaft (rearward) of the main mast, but forward of the rudder post.

Dictionary of the Marine defined "Bark", as "a general name given to small ships: it is however peculiarly appropriated by seamen to those which carry three masts without a mizzen top-sail."
