## Kinney County's oldest citizen turns 100!

"I feel good! I don't even feel like I'm 100!" said Kinney County's oldest citizen Theresa Garcia, about her 100th birthday.

Born Theresa Urbina to Juan and Virginia (Delgado) in Monterrey, Mexico on January 17, 1911, Garcia moved to Brackettville as a young girl. Garcia lived at 214 James Street in a house that still stands today.

Garcia lived in her James Street home until about ten years ago. Garcia currently lives with her granddaughter Noemi Martinez in Brackettville.

Garcia's mother died when she was only eight, but her father, Juan, a shoemaker at Fort Clark, stayed on in Brackettville where he raised his nine children. Garcia, the youngest and only

living sibling, married Victor Garcia, Sr. on November 19, 1933. Victor, Sr. was a cook at Fort Clark and Garcia was a wife, homemaker and mother to three children, Juan Garcia, Julia G. Terrazas and Victor Garcia, Jr.

Juan Garcia died at age one; Julia G. Terrazas passed away at age 74 in May, 2010; and Vic-

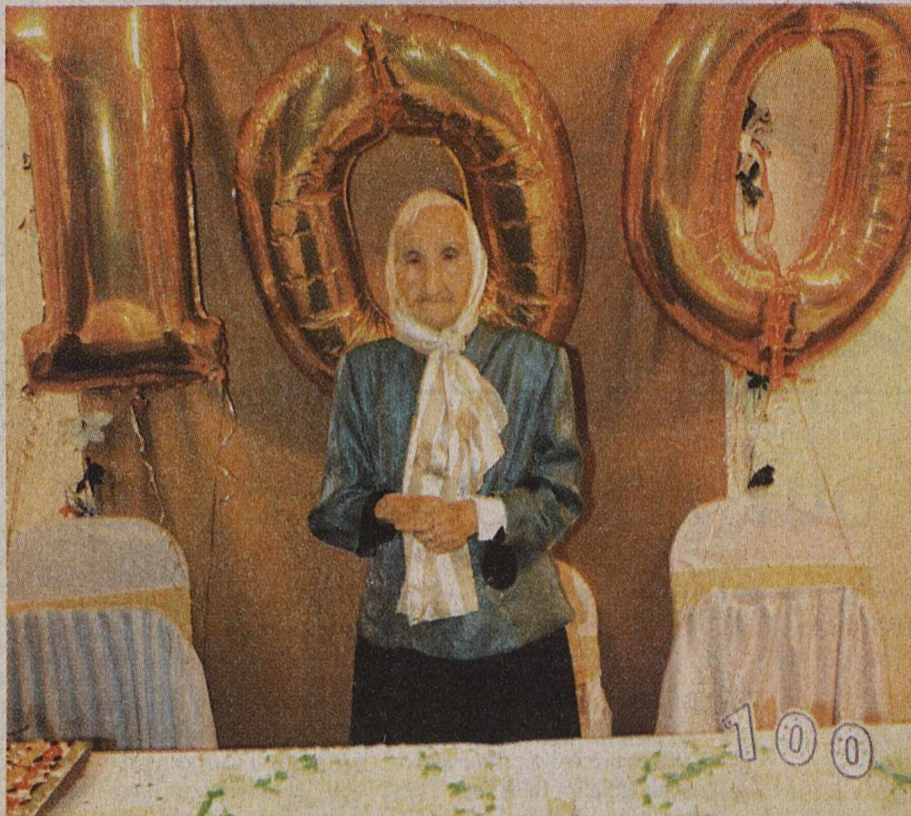
tor Garcia, Jr. currently lives in Las Vegas, Nevada.

Garcia was surrounded by her loved ones at the Fort Clark Service Club on January 16, as she blew out her candles. The guests journeyed from as far away as Nevada, California, Illinois and Michigan.

At one hundred years old, Garcia has been given the rare

opportunity to see her family grown from her own three children to one that has nine grandchildren, 27 great-grandchildren and 24 great-great grandchildren.

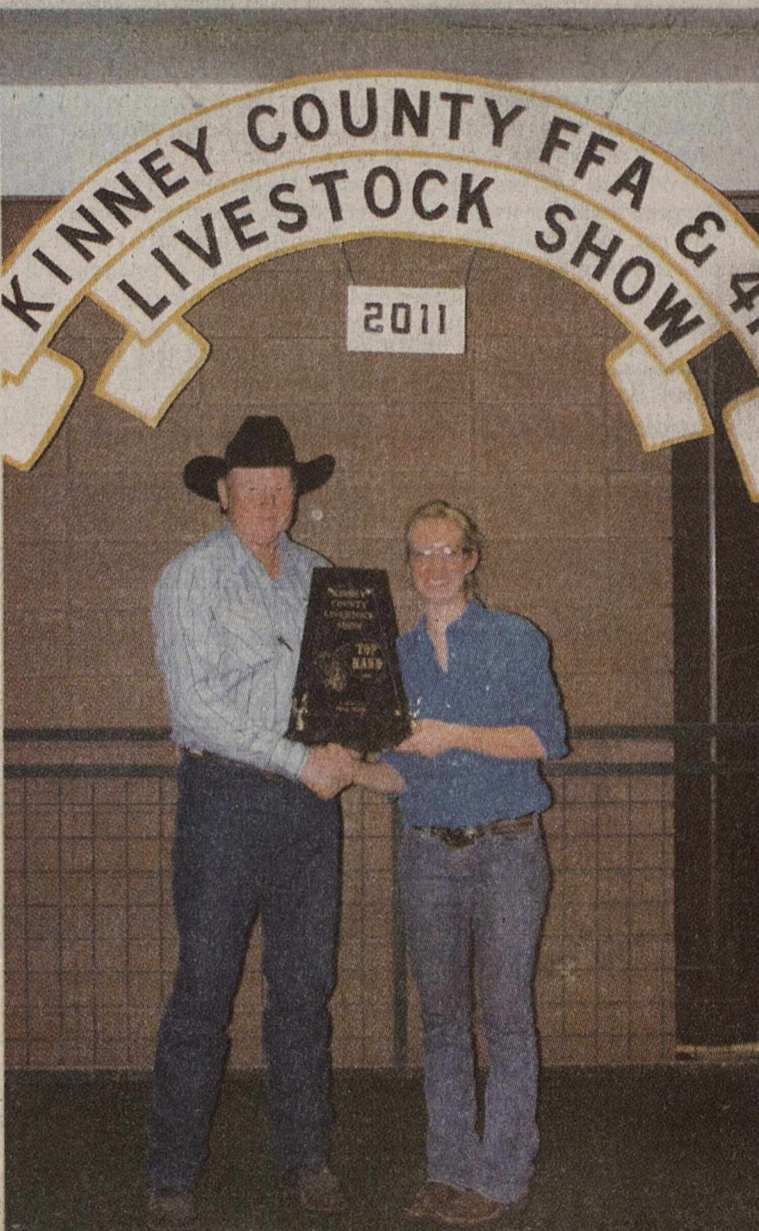

## Local food pantry distributed 50K pounds in 2010

It was a record year of product distribution for the South Texas Food Bank in Kinney County.

According to South Texas Food Bank 2010 figures, 4,672 Kinney County families were served. Among them were 6,734 adults and 2,540 children. Kinney is one of eight counties served by the Laredo-based South Texas Food Bank, a member of the national organization Feeding America and the Texas State Food Bank Net-

work. The other seven counties are Webb (Laredo), Zapata, Starr (Rio Grande City), Jim Hogg (Hebbronville), Maverick (Eagle Pass), Val Verde (Del Rio) and Dimmit (Carrizo Springs).

The South Texas Food Bank distributed an all-time record 12,424,080 (12.4 million) pounds in 2010, including 50,325 pounds in Kinney County.

The food bank depends on pantries and agencies for distribution.

The South Texas Food Bank distributes food in Brackettville

at one pantry, Kinney County Church Alliance, 116 West Crockett Street. The organizer is Elizabeth Goebel. She can be reached at 830 - 563-5482.

Elia Solis, STFB agency-pantry coordinator, hailed the annual figures as "all-time records. The overall numbers show a high increase from years past. It shows our economy is still down. And we're always looking for more distribution sites." For information call Solis at (956)726-3120.

The South Texas Food Bank helps the unemployed, underemployed and those living on fixed incomes with supplement-

tal food. "Families just run out of money to buy food after paying their mortgage-rent, utilities, transportation and other bills. That's when the food bank steps in," Alfredo (Chawy) Castillo, STFB executive director said. Castillo, the executive director for 12 years, announced at the January board of directors meeting that he is leaving the position Dec. 31.

The board has named a committee to search for his replacement. Olga Maldonado, a native of Eagle Pass and executive with AEP-Texas in Laredo, is the food board president.

The food bank is a non-profit 501 c-3 organization. Tax deductible donations can be sent to PO Box 2007, Laredo, Tex., 78044. 

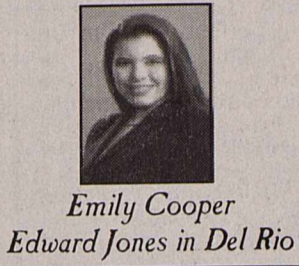

## Be prepared for early and possibly unwanted retirement



Given the economic climate we're in, you may one day be faced with a downsizing or otherwise forced to retire earlier than you had planned. But even if that happens, you can still maintain control of your financial future — if you make the right moves.

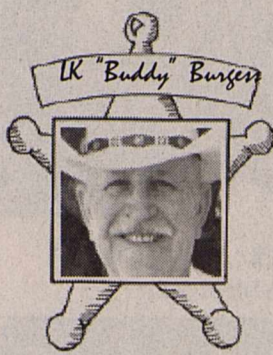
Unfortunately, many of us are ill prepared for events such as forced early retirement. In 2009, more people filed for Social Security than any year in history, with a big increase in the number receiving reduced benefits because they filed before their full retirement age. And they paid a heavy price, too — 62-year-old workers who filed for benefits early lost about 25 percent of their monthly benefits over waiting until their "full" retirement age of 66, according to the Social Security Administration.

Of course, if you are forced to take an early retirement, you, too, may need to tap into your Social Security earlier than you planned. But that's just the beginning — you might also need to start withdrawals from your IRA and your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan, even though you had planned on leaving those accounts intact for a few more years. And that's why you won't want to wait until early retirement is thrust upon you before taking action. While you're still working, consider these steps:

- Boost your contributions to retirement plans. Put as much as you can possibly afford into your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored plan. Every time your salary goes up, try to increase the amount you contribute to your retirement plan. Also, contribute regularly to your traditional or Roth IRA.
- Be prepared to rebalance your portfolio. If you're facing a forced early retirement, or even if you think it's a possibility, you may want to rebalance your portfolio to provide more opportunities for income. Talk to your financial advisor about income strategies appropriate for your particular situation.
- Build up cash accounts. Even during "normal" times, it's a good idea to keep an emergency fund, in cash or other liquid vehicles, containing six to 12 months' worth of living expenses. If you suspect a forced early retirement is heading your way, try to beef up your cash holdings as much as possible.
- Repay any 401(k) loans. Once you've left your employer, you may be forced to repay a 401(k) loan within two months — an obvious hardship during a stressful time.
- Work part-time. Even if you were forced to retire from one job, it doesn't mean you couldn't find another. This might be the perfect time to take a part-time job in an area in which you've always wanted to work.
- Get some help. By consulting with a professional financial advisor, you may find that you actually can afford to retire early. A financial advisor can help you develop those income and spending strategies that are appropriate for your situation. And the earlier you get this type of help, the more options you ultimately may have.
- You may not be able to avert an unwanted, early retirement, but by preparing for it, as far in advance as possible, you can improve your chances of maintaining the retirement lifestyle you've envisioned.

## BISD urges legislators to make education a priority

**Brackett ISD Urges Legislators to Make Education a Priority**  
Lawmakers must make education a priority this legislative session if they are to find a solution to the broken school finance system and properly fund public schools in Texas. Brackett Independent School District adopted a resolution on November 8, 2010 in an effort to raise awareness of the growing financial crisis public school districts are facing.

The resolution adoption encourages state legislators to work with local school board members and other stakeholders with an attitude of the highest priority. With this resolution adoption, Brackett ISD joins over 460 other school districts across Texas that have done the same as part of the "Make Education a Priority" campaign launched by the Aledo ISD Board of Trustees.

The campaign aims to unite school districts to support and share with our legislators an attitude of making education a sincere priority during the 2011 82nd Legislative Session.

The campaign calls for a commitment to fix the broken system of school finance and to properly fund education. One of the main causes of the current school finance crisis is the 2006 legislation (House Bill 1) that has proven to fall short of properly funding Texas public schools. The state cut property taxes by one third and did not establish a new stream of revenue to completely make up the difference.

Currently, more than half of the school districts in Texas are being forced to use dollars from their fund balances for daily operating expenditures - a practice that is neither financially sound nor sustainable over a long-term. In addition, teaching positions are being eliminated, salaries reduced and local educational programs removed to meet reduced budgets.

In 2007 and 2009, legislators were unsuccessful in addressing school funding shortcomings. With a budget deficit of nearly 27 billion, legislative leadership must work with the education community to find a creative solution that does not incur significant cost.

"Until education becomes a

real priority, serious solutions to school finance will never be found," says Bobby J Rigues, Aledo ISD Board Vice-President.

"We are asking our legislators for their support and commitment to work with stakeholders to begin fixing the broken school funding system in Texas - together, we can. This issue has grown since 2006.

We are now at the door step of 2011. We cannot wait until 2013."

*Under the current funding system, Brackett ISD's funding per student is in the bottom 5% of the school districts in the state. This funding system was established by HB 1 in the 2006 legislative session and is broken and must be fixed. The children of Kinney County deserve the same educational opportunities as children living in other areas of Texas. Anything less is inequitable and unacceptable.*

The campaign hopes to se-

cure as many resolutions as possible to present to legislators, during the 82nd Legislative Session, which started last week.
