Recently, an active FCS charter member wrote an epistle stating some confusing contradictions. The writer remembered the "Glory Days", in fact he joined FCS at that time and probably paid a few thousand dollars for privilege since many charter members have related that fact.

So, one may assume he did the same. At the time, the member thought it was worth every penny, for he enjoyed the facilities, activities, security, and the beautiful grounds. I've been told that at times there were some disagreements, but for the most part everyone seemed to get along and conducted themselves in a civilized and refined manner. There were no known acts of family violence, spousal abuse, and vulgar language; therefore, the life style was appealing enough for the member to join FCS. 


