The City of Brackettville will be conducting its annual council election on May 14 and the ballot poses an all female ticket.

The council maintains positions for five alderpersons and one mayoral position with a staggered two year terms. This spring, positions for Place 1 and Place 3 were open to the election process.

Nancy Mendoza, currently serving as alderwoman for Place 1 will be challenged by Tencha Pena.

Incumbent for Place 3, Mary Flores will be chal-

The rest of the female dominated council includes Mayor Zandra Negrete; Alderman Place 2 Plunker Sheedy; Alderman Place 4 Francisca Chica Hernandez; and Alderman Place 5 Demetrius Williams.

Early voting begins on Monday, May 2, through Friday, May 6, from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. and continue on Monday, May 9, and on Tuesday, May 10, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the Brackett ISD Auditorium.

Election Day will be on Saturday, May 14, from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at the Brackett ISD Auditorium.

Grand Jury indicts 2

The Kinney County Grand Jury indicts two more people on April 4.

After indicting 11 people on February 14, the April jury billed the two cases presented to them.

Arnulfo Garcia, Case No. 2265, was indicted for attempted sexual assault that was alleged to hap-


pen on February 11, 2011. The indictment read, "with specific intent to commit the offense of sexual assault of (a woman), do an act, to-wit: attempted to remove her clothing and attempting to touch the sexual organ of (the woman), which amounted to more than mere preparation that tended but failed to effect the commission of the offense intended."

Also indicted by the Grand Jury was Nyshe Weaver York,

Case No. 2266. York's indictments reads on March 16, she, "did then and there intentionally and knowingly use a deadly weapon, to wit: a firearm and did then and there intentionally and knowingly threaten (a man) with imminent bodily injury by the use of said deadly weapon. And (the man) had a dating relationship with Nyshe Weaver York."

Both cases will be tried in the 63rd Judicial District Court.

Former editor marches on Capitol

On March 22, former editor of The Brackett News (Weekly) Allison LaMascus Taylor traveled to Austin to try and persuade legislators from cutting thirty percent of Pediatric Home Health Care and Nursing.

Taylor, pregnant in September, 2009, and six weeks from her due date, gave birth to her third child, James Wilson Taylor, a son. Baby James was born under complicated circumstances and has many severe medical conditions that have required around the clock care. The proposed State budget cuts to home health nursing have the potential to further overload the Taylor family's budget and jeopardize James' overall health.

Taylor and her husband, both gainfully employed with private health insurance, need help in caring for their young son and without the medical programs that subsidize the expenses, fear the worst.

"On March 22 at a rally at the Texas State Capitol my sister, Allison, tried to persuade the legislature from cutting almost 30 percent of funding for Pediatric Home Health Care and Nursing. This would greatly affect my sister's life and that of her family, namely my nephew JW. Without the care he receives from his nurses 24 hours a day their family couldn't function normally and his fate would be sealed. I am so incredibly proud of my little sister for acting on her conviction and getting up in front of the hundreds who joined us in protest of this budget cut and speaking from her heart!! What courage and grace! We followed up the rally with a visit to numerous legislators' offices asking them to support NOT cutting this much needed funding from the state budget. Democracy in action! I encourage you to please email, write, or call your representatives' offices and ask them to oppose cutting the funding for Pediatric Home Health Care and Nursing!!! Help my sister keep JW in their home where he belongs," said Taylor's sister Lindy Orozco last week.

Orozco said she believes families will be forced to quit working in order to qualify for state and federal medical insurance programs. She said the State would end up paying for the healthcare needs of an entire family instead of helping pay for just the medical needs of the child. Orozco said in the worst case scenario, some of the children that currently benefit from being at home with their families with skilled nurses could be placed in nursing homes if these cuts are enacted because the cost to care for them would be too great.

Taylor and her husband, both of Brackettville, currently live in Uvalde to be closer to a hospital facility and are fortunate to have the emotional support of many friends and family members, but know the cuts to the nursing care budget would adversely affect the care of their youngest child.

“Stress Busters” for the Sandwich Generation

You may be too busy to realize it, but April is Stress Awareness Month. Sponsored by the Health Resource Network, a nonprofit health education group, Stress Awareness Month is designed to promote aware-

ness about ways to reduce stress in our lives. And if you're a member of the so-called "Sandwich Generation," you may well have plenty of stress to deal with — especially financial stress. And that's why you may want to look at this month as an opportunity to explore ways of "de-stressing" yourself.
To understand the scope of the problem facing people in your situation, consider this: One out of every eight Americans aged 40 to 60 is raising a child while caring for an aging parent, according to the Pew Research Center. The definition

of "eldercare" can range from having the parent living in one's home to helping pay for the parent's stay in an assisted living or nursing home facility. When you consider the costs involved in this type of care, added to the expenses of raising your children and possibly even providing some financial support to them as young adults, it's easy to see how you could potentially face enormous strains, both emotionally and financially.
To help ease this burden, consider these suggestions:
• Save. As a Sandwich Generation member, you're probably within shouting distance of your own retirement — so you need to save for it. This may not be easy. You don't know how much financial support you may someday have to provide your elderly parents — and even after your children are grown, they may need some help from you. Unfortunately, in helping these "boomerang" children, many people disrupt their day-to-day cash flow and raid their savings. That's why it's important to try to "pay yourself first" by deferring part of each paycheck into a 401(k) and by automatically moving money each month from your checking or savings account into an IRA.
• Talk. Many people in the "Greatest Generation" (over age

80) have not even prepared a will. If your parents are in that group, you may want to talk to them about taking action. Also, find out who, if anyone, is handling their investments. And ask if your parents understand how Medicare works and if they need to add supplemental health insurance, such as Medigap. Plus, you need to find out if your parents have created a power of attorney or health care directive. It's best to have these conversations sooner rather than later.
• Delegate. You eventually may have to take some responsibility for your parents' care — but you don't have to do it alone. You could, for example, work with a financial services provider that offers trust services, which can be invaluable if your parents are incapacitated and useful even if they aren't. A professional trust officer can, among other duties, help manage your parents' investments, pay their bills, keep their records and supervise distribution of their assets to beneficiaries. In short, a qualified trust officer can make life a lot easier for you.
Stress Awareness Month lasts only 30 days, but by taking the right steps, you can de-stress yourself for many years to come. After all, just because you're in the Sandwich Generation, it doesn't mean you have to be "squished."
