We have some very poor roads here in Brackettville. Why? Some say its because once the roads were paved 30 years ago, the city never budgeted year after year to take care of them. Others say its bc the city is broke and has bad credit and cant get loans and grants, etc. Maybe it just would cost a millions that the city doesnt have right now and thats just the way it is, but one thing I know is that its not City Manager Henry Garcia's fault or Mayor Zandra Negrete's fault. We can probably blame them for other things, but their respective salaries have little to do with the all the potholes.

Right now the County has \$110,000 in grant money to use to pave some roads in Brackettville. The money cannot be used to do anything else or used anywhere else except within the city limits and it has to be used by August or it has to be returned and some other county will get to use it.

It was decided the three streets around the school would be the least controversial roads to pave since the roads around the school are used by nearly all the residents of the

county. Wow, were they wrong! Everyone is mad.

The project will cost appx \$140K and the grant is for \$110K. So an idea for the school, county and the city to split up the extra \$30K was tossed around, but the school is facing HUGE cutbacks so they had to decide do they chip in to pave the roads or do they keep an extra teacher in the elementary school? They have to choose. Chipping in or saving a job that leads to educating a child.

Everyone wants the roads paved. And the elected officials have to make the decisions they feel are the best for the people they represent. School board members represent the children and the education of the children NOT paving the roads. I think they would have chipped in if they were not worried about the state cutting the budget. In the same breath i would hope elected officials take into account that the average citizen could give a crap where the money comes from to pave the roads, they just want it done, so dont hold it against them when they get mad.
