Should the penalties in Texas be collected in full, County attorney Brady of Travis county, will recelve one of the largest fees ever arned by an attorney in Texas. The penalties amount to a total of $\$ 1,623$, 000, of which $\$ 1,459,500$ acerues under he antl-trust laws of 1899 and $\$ 74,000$ inder the ant--trust laws of 1903.
Under the anti-trust laws of 1898 County Attorney Brady recelves 25 per cent of the penalties as a fee, and under the antl-trust laws of 1903 he reeelves 10 per cent of the Arat $\$ 1,000$ and 8 per cent of the halance of the penaties. This will give Mr. Brady a tee of $\$ 391,045$.
