For feed and coal, see the Wichita passed by the legistature governing the santtary conditions of publle bulldings, conches, etce, lays down some rigid laws for the meat markets, and It is sald that Dr. Brumby is making every effort to nee that the laws are strictly enforced. The rules pertaining to the meat markets are as follows, and are now effective
"In' every meat market, each room whereln meat ts handled or stored shall be completely screened at doors, windows and other openings with not coarser than 14 -mesh wire gauze, and such gauze when rusted or otherwise rendered pervious to Insects, shall be removed and replaced with impervious removed scraps of meat, ofral and other organic matter shall not be left enorganic matter shall not be left en-
posed to the atmosphere of the room, posed to the atmosphere of the room,
but must be kept in a closed recepticle, which same must be emptied at least once a day. Also the meat for sale shall not be kept exposed to the air except in such quantities as are needed for immediate use, but it shall be ke in refrigerators or ice chests.
" "Every market must have a refrig. erator or ice chest of suttable size in use which shall be scoured and aired thoroughly at least once a week, and oftener if necessary, so that it will be kept sweet and cleañ at all times. "The floor of every meat market in this Btate shall be scrubbed once dally other equally good disinfectant, sald scrubbing to extend not only in front of the counters, but also behind the counters, and all floors covered with counters, and all floors covered with sawdust or sand, or in any way encumbered, so that scrubbing shall be changed, an
done dally.
"No person suffering from tuberculosls or other infectious or contagious diseases shall knowingly be employed In any capacity in any meat market.
All meat that is or becomes talhted All meat that is or becomes talated
or attacked by putrefactive bacteria, shall be elther tanked or removed from the premises at once, and said meat shall not be stored in any ice chest or refrigerator. Chopping blocks shall be scraped once dally and counters thoroughly scoured. Knives, saws ang other implements must be scalded and washed thoroughly dally.
"The penalty for violating any of these provisions is a fine of not less than $\$ 50$ n

Bucket of Blood District is to be Made Safe for strangéra.
Fort Worth, Tex., Sept. 10.-In a sweeping order issued Tuesday by Commissionen Mulkey, Chief Maddox was instructed to rid the elty of the undesirable characters that infest the district between Jennings a avenue and Throckmorton street and Thirteenth street and Rallroad avenue. Since the evacuation of the Acre, the section described has become the most:notorious rendezvous for desperate negro crimtnals in the city, Scarcely a night passes wthout some crime or fight the settlement.
Within the past three months five serious shooting affrays have occurred in this section and the police have named it the "Bucket of Blood." Three of the shootings resulted in murder cases and more than thirty arrests have been made there. The police have begun to look upon that locality with a feeling of apprehension and don't care to investigate any reported trouble there without the presence. of fellow officers.
It was in the Bucket of Blood district that Vestus Patillo, a negro, fired on the police and was himself badly wounded last Saturday night in a pistol battle with Patrolmen Aiken, Turshooting affatr Commissioner Mulkey has declded to assume personal charge of the cleaning out of the distrctt and or cheang out of the district o provide ample poot of honeat to provid of ample
method of livelihood.
In speaking of the neighborhood on Tuesday morning, Commissioner Mul key explained that the majority of the restaurants and saloons in the vicinity were nothing more nor less than blinds and pittalls for the unwary stranger and unsuspecting youth, with the result that the present police pro tection was wholly Inadequate toward stemming the tide of crime and pro viding ample protection. Chiet of Po lice Maddox, upon receiving the or ders, said that they would be carried out to the letter and that regardless of excuses the habitues of the vicinity would be compelled either to leave the city or else engage in respectable bus iness.
