## WORLD FAMOUS FRAUDS

Were Hatched Out in Cunning Brain
Bankers Were Her Dupes.

Colvmbus, Ohio, Oct. 11-Emil Hoover, a son of Mrs. Cassie Chad-
wick, made arrangements today to have the body of his mother sent to Woodstock, Canada, for burial. The
body is now at a Columbius undertak. body is now at a Columbius undertaklog establishment, where the publle
was permitted to view it this after. Mrs. Chadwick's death occurred at 10:15 last night. She had been in a
comatose condition. for several hours and the end came peacefully. No friends or relatives were at her death
bed. Mrs. Cassie Chadwick, whose mald-
n name was Elizabeth Bigely, was a native of Woodstock, Canada. She frst came into public notice in Toledo, she told fortwenes under the name of Madame De Vere. While ne name of she forged the name of Richard Brown, Youngstown, Ohio, and for this Columbas sent to the penitentiary at Columbus for nine years. she was a natural daughter of CarneWith the recelpt of Reynolds in her possession, Mrs. Chadwick went to difrerent banks and many capitalists making loans and paying not only high
Interest to the banks, but heavy bonuses to the bank olicials who loanied
her the money. The extent of these transactions will never be fully known, ut they ran up into the millions. They involved men of high standing heavy losses to many banks.
In November, 1904, she was sued by Mass, from whom she had borrowed large amount, which she was unable co pay. Other creditors came down apon her and within a short time she was placed under arrest by the Fedspiring with Charles Beckwith, the president, and A. B. Spear of a nationat bank at Oberlin, Ohlo, whech had been substantially looted. Mrs. Chadwlek had obtained from this instituwas com large sums of money that it was compelled to close its doors, caus-
