dertaken by the Federal government untt July 1, 1906, yet as a result there have been released from quar intine certain-areas in Virginia. Noíth earo Hina, Tennessee, Kentucky, Texas and
Callfornia, amounting approximately Callfornta, amounting approximately to 20,000 square miles, twenty counties
previously in quarantine have been previousiy in quarantine have bee
admitted to provisional quarantine and good headway has been made in still other areas. During the last fiscal year the work has been pursued in cooperation with State authoritles in the States above named, and in Georgia, Alabama, Arkansas, Missouri, Loulsiana and Oklahoma. It has included 1, 934,448 inspections of cattle, 359,674 of
which were re-inspections, thus indiWhich were re-inspections, thus indi
cating the inspection of $1,394,814$ individual cattle, these comprising 95 ,
dit 566 separate herds. Various approved methods for the eradication of ticks have been used, including pasture ro-
tation and dipping tation and dipping, spraying and hand dressing with ofl and oil emulsion. The number of cattle moved from
the area quarantined for Southern ever to Northern markets during the 629 , shine season. of 1906 was 1,000 , 629, shipped in 36.213 cars. These cat
the were all for immediate slaughter and were handled under the supervis ion and regulations of the department of agriculture at Washington. There were also inspected in the provisional
quarantined areas of Texas and Oklahoma 126,238 head of cattle, which purposes other than immedlate slaughter. Supervision was exercised over
137,902 dippings in crude petrolium, avd over the cleaning and disinfection of 36,895 cars.
