



His folks were on the main street which ran down the middle of town and could not see him, and he was only across the tracks.

Arnold said many of the wells in this area have gone dry and when asked if they could not drill deeper, he said they were already to the "red bed," and there was no water. Arnold said he didn't believe we would ever run out of drinking water but the irrigation for farmers was looking bad.


