Bovina Post Office Is 100 Years Old January 31

The Bovina Post Office was established January 31, 1899. It was first located in a half-dugout near the XIT Ranch headquarters which was north of Highway 60. Later it was moved into the ranch headquarters. The first Main Street location was in a mercantile store

owned by Frank Hastings and Barnes where it remained until it was destroyed by fire. After the fire it was moved to the Roy B. Ezell home a block south of Main Street near the site of City Drug. Then it was moved to the north side of Main Street where it remained for over forty years.

The post office's present building at the corner of Avenue B and Second Street was dedicated on April 16, 1966.

Winners Are Named At 52nd Annual Stock Show

The 52nd Annual Parmer County Junior Livestock Show was held last Friday and Saturday, January 22-23 at the Friona Community Center-Showbarn.

Lamb judging began the activities on Friday morning with 58 lamb entries. The goat show immediately followed the lamb show. There were 13 goat entries. Dennis Luce of Ft. Sumner, New Mexico, served as the judge with Sonny Moore of Bovina as lamb division superintendent.

Two medium wool lambs took the top honors. Cade Morris, a Lazbuddie exhibitor, was the owner of the lamb that was named Grand Champion Lamb of the show. His 118 pound entry was the winner of the medium light medium wool class. The 156 pound heavyweight medium wool lamb shown by Cassie London of Friona took the honors of Reserve Grand Champion.

Lamb breed champions were shown by: M'Kell Jarecki of Friona, finewool; Cade Morris of Lazbuddie, finewool cross; Cade Morris of Lazbuddie, medium wool; and

Suzanne Mason of Lazbuddie, Southdown.

Reserve breed champions included: T.J. Randolph of Friona, finewool; J'Lond Jarecki of Friona, finewool cross; Cassie London of Friona, medium wool; and Kelby Monroe of Friona, Southdown.

The Grand Champion Goat was shown by Candace Davis of Farwell. Her 79 pound entry was the winner of the heavy market class. Travis Stanberry of Bovina, with his 71 pound light market goat, won Reserve Grand Goat honors.

Recognized as top showmen in the lamb division were Luke London and Jordan Monroe of Friona, Junior I; Suzanne Mason of Lazbuddie and Keith Hunt of Friona, Junior II; and J'Lond Jarecki of Friona and Cade Morris of Lazbuddie, Seniors.

There were 212 barrow entries with judging beginning at noon Friday. Eddie Smallwood of O'Donnell judged the barrows with Richard Haseloff of Farwell serving as division superintendent.

Jeremy Campbell's heavy-weight Crossbred barrow, weighing in at 240 pounds, was named Grand Champion of the 1999 show. He is a Friona exhibitor. Robbie Jan Barrett of Friona took Reserve Grand Champion honors with her 212 pound Duroc barrow that had earlier been named Breed Champion.

Cattle judging began at 8 a.m., Saturday, January 23 with Mac Langford of Farwell serving as cattle superintendent. Bryon Reynolds of Lynn County judged the animals.

Landon Parham of Lazbuddie took the Grand Champion Steer awards. His 1390 pound Crossbred steer won the heavy class. Alicia Smith of Friona was the owner of the steer named Reserve Grand Champion. Her 1220 pound Crossbred steer had earlier won the light class.

Jason Jesko of Lazbuddie entered two English steers. His 1165 pound entry was named Breed Champion with his 1260 pound steer being named Reserve Breed Champion.

The Grand Champion Heifer was shown by Triston Thorn of Lazbuddie. The Crossbred heifer weighed 820 pounds.

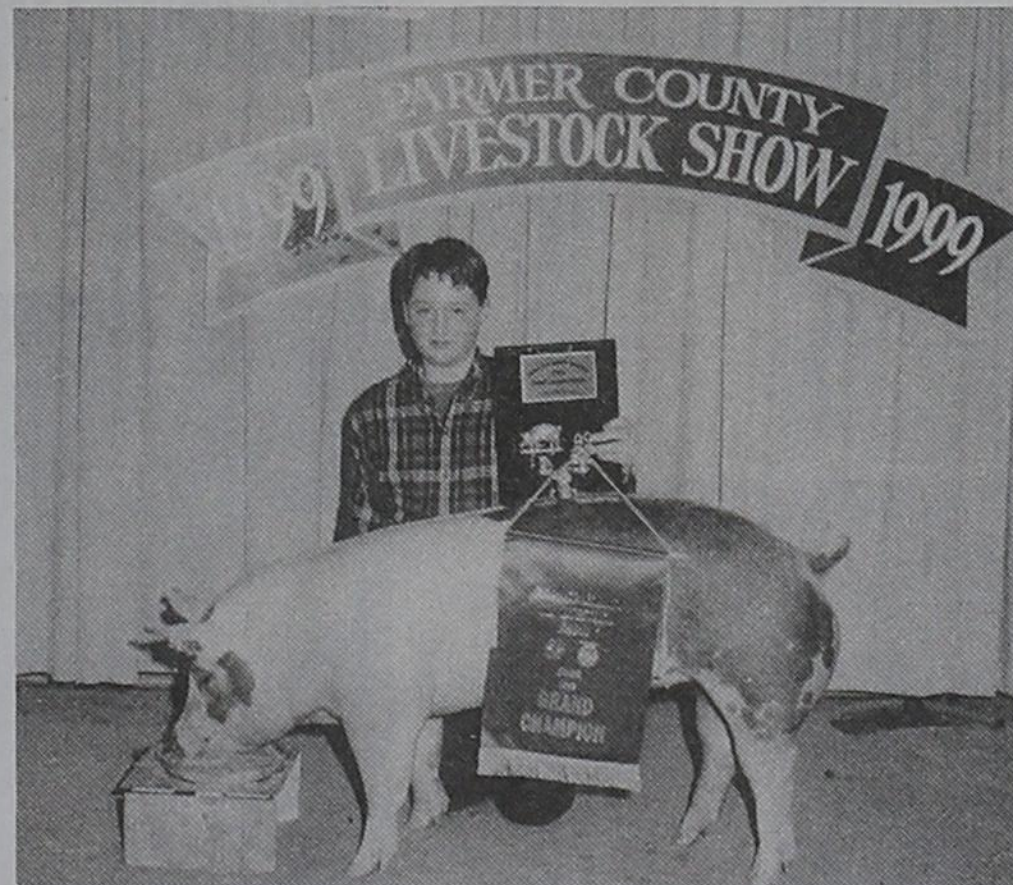

The warrant service resulted in the arrests of Robert G. Thurman, 35, and Melissa Suzanne Thurman, 33, on charges of possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute.

Scooter's Scoops

Seems like we just can't get rain and meteorologists are predicting that there is a good possibility the "Dust Bowl" days could very well be with us again, unless we get moisture soon.

I was raised at Hereford and was too young to remember much about those good old days that were not so good, but do remember how bad it was according to the stories. I remember how we played in the "bar ditches" after the dust storms and how it looked like drifts of fine brown powder.

I talked to some of our people who had been here during those days and everyone had stories to tell about them.

Amy Hromas said she remembered back one beautiful Sunday afternoon when she and Lois Billingslea rode their horses and were caught up in the storm. She said it was upon them before they realized it.

They ran to their neighbors, Mr. Hanna, and opened his door, and went in without being invited. It was like someone had turned the lights off, she said Lois remembered how worried Mr. Hanna became.

There were times, she said, that people could not sleep and had to put wet clothes over their mouths in order to breathe because the dust was so heavy.

Amy's husband, Arnold said he could remember those dust bowl days and said, "It would get so 'dadburn' dark that you could not see your hand in front of your face!"

He recalled one day when he was only a youngster and was plowing and a cyclone rolled in. He said he kept waiting for some of his folks to come for him but gave up and started walking down the road which is highway 60 now. His folks were on the main street which ran down the middle of town and could not see him, and he was only across the tracks.

Arnold said many of the wells in this area have gone dry and when asked if they could not drill deeper, he said they were already to the "red bed," and there was no water. Arnold said he didn't believe we would ever run out of drinking water but the irrigation for farmers was looking bad.

There are those who predict that the Texas Panhandle will one day be a desert, as it was many years ago.

Arnold said he was now the oldest resident to have lived in Bovina all his life. His parents were Mr. and Mrs. E.A. Hromas.

Doris Wilson came to this area in 1928 and she said there were times that they had to eat what they already had, because the dust was too thick to prepare meals. She said it was a "black darkness" and not brown, when the storms came.

A person could see them coming and it looked like a big rolling black ball coming across the country.

She said they had a little lamp, and would light it when it became so dark and could barely see each other, though it was during the daylight hours. She also spoke of how they had to put wet clothes over their mouths

to breathe.

Doris told about one bad storm and during the blackness, their neighbor, a Mr. King, who lived southwest of Bovina began shouting, "The world is coming to an end!" It was so very scary, she said.

They lived in Apache, Oklahoma at one time, when she was a young person and a huge storm came. They went to the cellar and when they came out, everything was gone as if it had never been there.

She said the hail was also so hard that day, that it killed some of their livestock. The only way they survived was to try again, and said people were good to help each other.

As some say, "We don't know what the future holds, but know who holds the future." So maybe one of these days...It will rain.

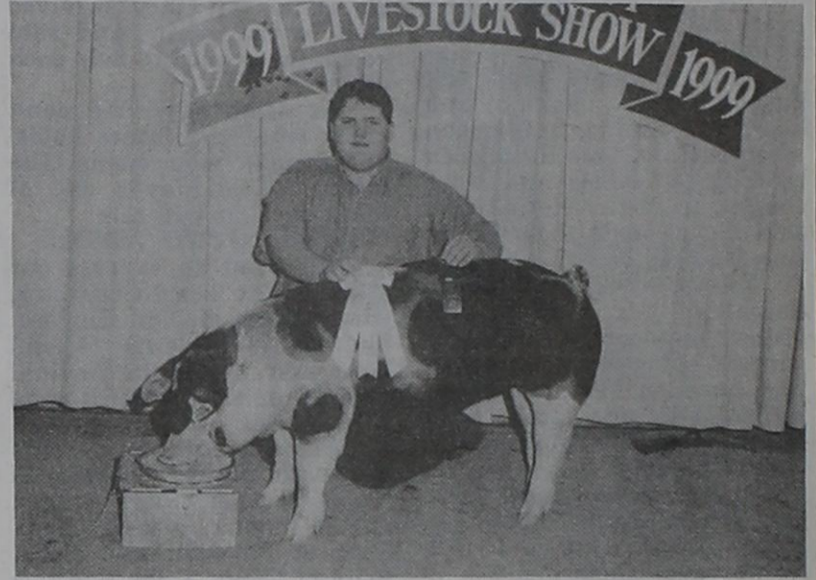
