SEEK PARDON FOR VAN SHAIK.

Texas Pilots Interested in Behalf of General Slocum Commander.

Galveston, Tex., Mar. 17.—Through the Pilots' association petitions directed to President Roosevelt asking for the pardon of Captain William Van Shaick, the former commander of the steamer General Slocum, which was burned three years ago near Hell Gate in New York harbor, are being circulated here. Signatures of many citizens, as well as those of numerous visitors to the city from all parts of the country are being appended.

Captain Van Shaick was convicted on charges of misconduct in connection with the burning of the excursion boat, in which several hundred lives were lost.

The petition acknowledges the importance of such life-saving equipment as is required by the government, but pleads that boat masters are powerless to maintain such when no action to that end had been taken by the owners and United States inspectors.

TO EXAMINE WATER.

Dr. Reed Goes to Sulphur Springs to Investigate Method in Cleaning Water.

Dr. J. F. Reed left last night for a trip to Sulphur Springs. At Fort Worth he will be joined by Henry Sayles, one of the directors in the Wichita Falls Water and Light Company, who will go to Sulphur Springs with him. Dr. Reed goes to Sulphur Springs to investigate the quality of the water after it is clarified by the process used there, especially from a physician's standpoint.

If it is found that the water at Sulphur Springs contains nothing injurious to the health of the consumer it is probable that the same method used in clarifying the water there will be installed here, provided that the city council and the water company can come to a satisfactory agreement concerning a new contract.

Fire at Thornberry.

Mr. C. J. Shumake lost his barn Sunday night, March 15. It was almost a total loss, twenty-five tons of cotton seed, five hundred bushels of corn, three hundred bushels of oats and about six tons of hay being burned. The cause of the fire is not known. Mr. and Mrs. Shumake were in Fort Worth with their son and the other members of the family were at church.

Planting corn in Frieberg and Thornberry is the order of the day now. Farmers are very jubilant over the flattering prospects for wheat and oats in this section of the country.

Let every man do his duty and Wichita Falls will realize every prediction made for her growth and prosperity during the year 1908.

The contract for the building of the Wichita Falls and Southern railway from Olney to the coal fields in Young county on the Brazos river (a distance of only about twelve miles), is to be let this week, and it is calculated that the road will be completed within sixty days. This will open up what will probably prove to be the greatest coal field in Texas, and will make of Wichita Falls a manufacturing center second in importance to no town in the State, from the fact that it will have cheap fuel and is a railroad center.

With two candidates for mayor, two for tax collector and five for aldermen in the field, the municipal campaign is becoming interesting and the probabilities are that a large number of votes will be cast on election day. Now, if the city council will make the marshal's office elective instead of appointive there is no reason why there should ever be any lack of interest in the city elections.

"An equal distribution of municipal improvements; care in the expenditure of municipal funds, and strict oversight of all public corporations" is the platform of principles upon which an Amrillo candidate for alderman is making the race for that office. It is a good platform, but one which but few municipalities stand on.

Another public school building for Wichita Falls is badly needed. The two we have are crowded, and by the time another can be constructed, there will be need for it.

Just at this time business is a little quiet, caused largely by the fact that the farmers are busy planting crops and have not the time to come to town.

World's Greatest Bank.

The volume of business transacted by the Bank of France last year is indicated by the discount of 21,500,000 of bills aggregating in value more than \$3,000,000,000; applications for discounts for clients in Paris alone numbering 7,500,000.

The surprising fact is disclosed that the average value of all the 21,500,000 bills was \$145, and their life or usance until maturity, was a little more than twenty-six days; of the bills offered by Parisian clients, tradesmen, about 236,000 ranged from \$1.32 to \$10, \$1,400,000 from \$10 to \$20, and 3,800,000 above \$20.

The discount business at the bank was conducted at the uniform rate of 3 per cent, this being the official figure for ten months of the year. Another interesting fact is that its branches are so located throughout the republic as to be accessible to the entire population, thus enabling borrowers to obtain accommodation in the vicinity of their homes and those who seek to deposit their funds to effect such deposits with a minimum of inconvenience.

That the Bank of France profits, and that, too, largely, from its business is shown by the fact that the net dividend last year was at the rate of 17 1/2 per cent per annum. This will account for the maintenance of the value of \$800 a share, the par value of which is \$200.

Moreover, the credit of the bank is incomparably greater than that of any institution in the world. Even during the siege of Paris by the Germans, and when the commune was in possession of the gay capital, the notes of the bank fell only to a slight discount, and they immediately recovered when the crisis had passed. Furthermore, the bank holds the largest amount of gold of any purely trading institution in the world.

Farmers are Waking Up.
 At last the farmers of this country are beginning to wake up. They are organizing themselves into small business-like associations for the protection of their business. They propose now to have something to say about fixing the prices of their own products. The seedsmen decided what they would charge the farmer for his seed. The banks decided what they would charge him for the use of money with which to develop his land. The grain buyers and stockmen decided what they would pay him for the stuff they raised. The railroads decided what they would charge him to haul it to market. Merchants decided what they would charge him for the things he needed for himself, his wife and children.

The farmer simply took what was offered him and has never been in a position to control or even in a remote way increase the selling price of his product. Spasmodic efforts have been made to form organizations, but they have always failed because they were not founded upon correct business principles. During the past five or six years, however, farmers have been more successful in their efforts in this direction. They are learning wisdom from the trusts and the railroads and everybody else who has been fixing prices for them.

The idea of national organization to control prices has been practically abandoned and small companies to regulate prices in certain sections and communities or States are being formed. These are easy to manage. They effect better results and in time will, for all practical purposes, become a unit.

In these organizations the politician and the windjammer have been forced to take a back seat. In many instances high class business men who are familiar with all the conditions of trade in the cities are employed by the farmers to manage their companies. The buying and selling is placed in their hands and wherever this has been done the results have been of the greatest benefit.

The farmer has been the country's ox, and its ass long enough. He has sustained every industry by his own labor and has been poorly paid. He has been a long time in waking up, but at last he is beginning to realize, faintly as yet, the possibilities of the benefits that may come to him through wise moderate and just combinations.
